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INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE TOBIAS "TOBY" M. TIANGCO

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks the division of Barangay Tangos in Navotas City into two (2) distinct and independent barangays to be known as Barangay Tangos North and Barangay Tangos South.

Barangay Tangos has 364,501.74 square meters of land area. Its population of 33,211 ranks **SECOND** among the Barangays of Navotas City. Peace and order is becoming more difficult to maintain within the continuing growing population of Barangay Tangos. Further, the densely populated area will result to uneven delivery of basic services to the affected residents.

Thus, the people of Barangay Tangos are actively calling for the division of their Barangay into two considering the benefits it may bring to them.

In view thereof, the passage of this measure is earnestly urged.

AN ACT
DIVIDING BARANGAY TANGOS IN THE CITY OF NAVOTAS INTO TWO
(2) DISTINCT AND INDEPENDENT BARANGAYS TO BE KNOWN AS
BARANGAYS TANGOS NORTH AND TANGOS SOUTH

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. *Division of Barangay Tangos* – Barangay Tangos in the City of Navotas is hereby divided into two (2) distinct and independent barangays to be known as Barangay Tangos North and Barangay Tangos South.

SECTION 2. *Territorial Boundaries* – The territorial boundaries of each barangay created in the immediately preceding Section shall be as follows:

1. Barangay Tangos North

“Bounded on the Northwest (NW) and Northeast (NE)
by Malabon-Navotas River;

On the Southeast (SE) by centrelines of Ferry #5r; and

On the Southwest (SW) by centreline of M. Naval Street and
Manila Bay;

Containing an area of 212,964.02 square meters, more or
less.”

2. Barangay Tangos South

“Bounded on the Northwest (NW) and Northeast (NE) by
centreline of M. Naval Street;

On the Southeast (SE) by centreline of Manalaysay Street and Lots 4260 and 4261 (Andres Pascual), 4264, 4263, and 4252 all of Barangay San Roque, Navotas Cadastral Mapping Mcadm 582-D Case 12; and

On the Southwest (SW) by Manila Bay;

Containing an area of 151,537.72 square meters, more or less.”

SECTION 3. Conduct and Supervision of Plebiscite. - The Commission on Elections (COMELEC) shall conduct and supervise the plebiscite to be held in Barangay Tangos in the City of Navotas within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act.

The expenses for the plebiscite shall be borne by the City of Navotas.

SECTION 4. Special Election of Barangay Officials. - The first set of officials of the barangays created under Section 1 hereof shall be elected within ninety (90) days from approval by majority of the votes cast in a plebiscite held for the purpose.

The COMELEC shall conduct and supervise the special elections to be held in Barangay Tangos and Barangay Tangos South in the City of Navotas within sixty (60) days after the ratification of this Act in a plebiscite.

The expenses for such special elections shall be borne by the City of Navotas.

The incumbent barangay officials of Barangay Tangos shall continue to hold office and administer Barangays Tangos North and Tangos South until such time that the officials of the newly created barangays have been duly elected and qualified.

SECTION 5. Public Infrastructure and Facilities. All existing public infrastructures and facilities for public use existing therein at the time of the approval of this Act are hereby transferred without cost or compensation to and shall be administered by the new Barangays.

SECTION 6. Internal Revenue Allotment Shares. - All barangays herein created shall be entitled to Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) shares pursuant to Section 285 of Republic Act No. 7160 as amended, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen days (15) after its complete publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation in the Philippines.
