EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to declare June 11 of every year as a special non-working holiday for the City of Sagay, Negros Occidental, to give meaning to Republic Act 8192, otherwise known as the charter of the City of Sagay was signed into law on June 11, 1996 by then President Fidel V. Ramos. At present, Sagay City commemorates its charter anniversary every June 11 as a special non-working holiday to provide them time to prepare for this great event which is participated both by the private and government sectors.

Lastly, the proposed bill was approved by the House last congress and transmitted to the Senate for its consideration but the same was not considered by the Senate due to lack of material time.

In view of the foregoing, the approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

DECLARING JUNE 11 OF EVERY YEAR A SPECIAL NONWORKING HOLIDAY IN THE CITY OF SAGAY, PROVINCE OF NEGROS OCCIDENTAL IN COMMEMORATION OF ITS FOUNDATION DAY ANNIVERSARY

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. June 11 every year is declared a special nonworking holiday in the City of Sagay, Province of Negros Occidental in commemoration of its foundation day anniversary.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
