EXPLANATORY NOTE

Article XIV, Section 1 of the 1987 Constitution states that “[t]he State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all.”

Furthermore, Section 2 subparagraph (1) of the same Article provides that “[t]he State shall (1) Establish, maintain and support a complete, adequate and integrated system of education relevant to the needs of the people and society.”

ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL IN BARANGAY CAG-ABACA, MUNICIPALITY OF CATARMAN, PROVINCE OF NORTHERN SAMAR TO BE KNOWN AS CAG-ABACA NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. *Establishment of a National High School.* – There is hereby established under the supervision of the Department of Education, a national high school in Barangay Cag-abaca, Municipality of Catarman, Province of Northern Samar to be known as ***Cag-abaca National High School***.

Section 2. *Appropriations.* – The Secretary of Education shall immediately include in the Department's program the operationalization of Cag-abaca National High School, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

Section 3. *Implementation.* – The Secretary of Education shall issue such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Act.

Section 4. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette.
