

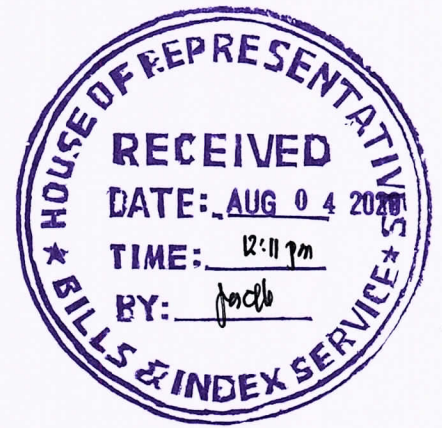

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This Bill seeks to designate February 21 of every year as the "Clarín Day" and a special non-working holiday in the municipality.

The municipality of Clarín, 2<sup>nd</sup> District of the Province of Misamis Occidental in Region X Northern Mindanao, a 4<sup>th</sup> class municipality comprising of 29 barangays and considered the "sumán" capital of the province, was founded on February 21, 1921.

Thus, in recognition of the men and women who pioneered the creation of the municipality of Clarín, this bill proposes to set February 21 as a non-working holiday to enable its residents and local officials to participate in the festivities to commemorate its Foundation Anniversary and reflect on the duties and responsibilities as people of Clarín.

In view of the foregoing, approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

**AN ACT DECLARING FEBRUARY 21 OF EVERY YEAR AS A SPECIAL NON-WORKING HOLIDAY IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF CLARIN, 2<sup>ND</sup> DISTRICT, PROVINCE OF MISAMIS OCCIDENTAL TO BE KNOWN AS "CLARIN DAY"**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

SECTION 1. February 21 of every year is hereby declared a special non-working holiday in the municipality of Clarin, Province of Misamis Occidental 2<sup>nd</sup> District in commemoration of its Founding Anniversary to be known as "Clarin Day".

SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general publication.
