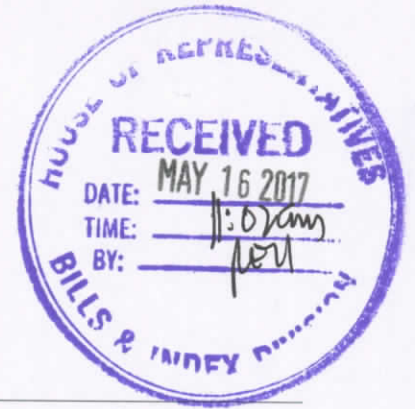

AN ACT
DECLARING SEPTEMBER 3 OF EVERY YEAR A SPECIAL NONWORKING HOLIDAY IN THE CITY OF BAGUIO, PROVINCE OF BENGUET, IN COMMEMORATION OF THE SURRENDER OF THE JAPANESE MILITARY FORCES LED BY GENERAL TOMOYUKI YAMASHITA IN BAGUIO CITY

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. September 3 of every year is hereby declared a special
2 nonworking holiday in the City of Baguio, Province of Benguet, in commemoration of
3 the surrender of the Japanese military forces led by General Tomoyuki Yamashita at
4 the American High Commissioner's Residence in Camp John Hay, Baguio City.

5 SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the
6 *Official Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
