WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State to promote quality education and to take appropriate steps to make quality education accessible to all and at all levels;

WHEREAS, universities and colleges, including state tertiary institutions or state universities and colleges (SUCs), were established in all regions in the entire country to meet the goals of providing wider access to quality tertiary education, with performance at par with higher education institutions (HEIs) in Metro Manila and the National Capital Region (NCR);

WHEREAS, the purpose of the professional licensure examinations administered for the various professional fields of study, including the study of law, is to help determine the cognitive competencies of graduates in their respective degree courses while ensuring likewise the standards of quality education in the country's HEIs, both for the private and state-run universities and colleges nationwide;

WHEREAS, especially for those who come from the provinces and who graduated from the various tertiary education schools outside Metro Manila, including those institutions offering professional courses such as Law, passing the licensure exam is a reflection and ultimate measurement of the quality of education standards of HEIs;

WHEREAS, graduates of the University of San Carlos (USC) School of Law and Governance in Cebu City have consistently posted exemplary performances in the examinations for the Bar, an outstanding feat for a law school not based in Metro Manila;

 WHEREAS, the Bar examinations, which is the only licensure exam that is not supervised by the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC), is one of the most difficult professional licensure examinations in the country:

WHEREAS, out of the total 6,344 examinees in the November 2016 Philippine Bar examination, 59.06 percent successfully passed;

WHEREAS, all of the 70 Bar examinees of the USC School of Law and Governance, who were likewise first-time takers, passed the Bar examinations, thus obtaining a 100 percent passing rate and a remarkable performance for the USC School of Law and Governance in the 2016 Bar examinations;

WHEREAS, the examinees who placed 1st, 3rd, 7th and 8th, respectively, in the 2016 Bar examinations were from the USC School of Law and Governance;

WHEREAS, the USC School of Law and Governance indeed deserves commendation and recognition for this remarkable feat;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives congratulate and commend the USC School of Law and Governance, in particular, for obtaining a 100 percent passing rate in the 2016 Philippine Bar Examination, and the University of San Carlos, in general, for this achievement and for living up to the challenge of providing quality competitive tertiary education, especially in professional courses such as Law;

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the USC's four (4) Bar top placers namely KAREN MAE L. CALAM (1st Placer, with an average score of 89.0500 percent), FIONA CRITY D. LAO (3rd Placer, with an average score of 88.8000 percent), ANN MARGARET E. MOMONGAN (7th Placer, with an average score of 87.8000 percent), and JEFFERSON L. GOMEZ (8th Placer, with an average score of 87.7000 percent), and all the 70 successful first-time 2016 Bar takers, be likewise congratulated and commended, not only for their accomplishment and collective pursuit for excellence, but more so for setting standards of excellence in law education for those in the region and other provinces to emulate and aspire for;

RESOLVED FINALLY, That a copy of this resolution of commendation be given to the USC School of Law and Governance through its Dean, Atty. Joan S. Largo, and be forwarded likewise to the Supreme Court and the Commission on Higher Education for their respective appropriate recognition of this singular achievement.
