The Chair then recognized Rep. Jose L. Atienza Jr., upon Rep. Bondoc's motion.

#### **MANIFESTATION OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza said that he welcomed Majority Leader Rodolfo C. Fariñas' memorandum on the need for calling the Roll every session day, that was distributed to the Members. As he added that this was in accordance with Section 72, Article XI of the amended provisional Rules of the House, he commended Majority Leader Fariñas for his industriousness and competence and said that he was supported by the equally competent Minority Leader Danilo E. Suarez.

#### **ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS**

Thereafter, Rep. Bondoc acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Reps. Gary C. Alejano, Leopoldo N. Bataoil, Amado T. Espino, Jr., Romeo M. Acop, and Carlito S. Marquez.

#### **APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL**

On a subsequent motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body approved Journal No. 15, dated August 24, 2016.

#### **THE PRIVILEGE HOUR**

With the permission of the Speaker and the unanimous consent of the House, on motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Chair declared a Privilege Hour.

The Chair subsequently recognized Rep. Edcel C. Lagman, upon Rep. Bondoc's motion.

#### **INSERTION INTO THE JOURNAL AND RECORD OF REP. LAGMAN'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

With the conformity of the Majority Leader and as moved by Rep. Lagman, there being no objection, the Body inserted into the day's Journal and Record of the House his privilege speech, entitled, "Disappeared Heroes and Martyrs" in celebration of the United Nations International Day of the Disappeared, to wit:

*Mr. Speaker, esteemed colleagues:*

*Five years ago, the United Nations declared August 30 as International Day of the Disappeared.*

*Today, as we pay tribute to the desaparecidos, we recognize their inspiring feats as heroes and martyrs of freedom and democracy.*

*Today, we demand justice for all victims of enforced disappearance and their families in no less than 88 countries including the Philippines.*

*The desaparecidos were abducted by agents of the State or by persons acting with their support or acquiescence, but who refuse to disclose any information on their custody or whereabouts.*

*Their inquiries being stonewalled, the families remain clueless about their disappeared loved ones' fate – many up to this very day.*

*Concealment of the fate and whereabouts of the victims places them beyond the protection of the law. Their merciless captors deny them their rights not to be arbitrarily deprived of their liberty; not to be subjected to torture, cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment; the rights to recognition as a person before the law; to be presumed innocent until the contrary is proved; to a fair and public trial; to human dignity and personal integrity; and most often the right to life. It may concomitantly violate the right to work, to a family, and the rights of children, even as it may restrain freedom of expression, religion, and association.*

*State authorities resort to enforced disappearance as a tool of repression to stifle dissent, to eliminate political opponents, isolate social activists from the resistance movement, and sow terror and fear in communities influenced by non-state armed groups.*



*In the Philippines, there are 2,239 reported victims of enforced disappearance from 1971 to the present administration. The unreported could be much higher. The Marcos regime registered the biggest number of reported victims of which 856 have been documented by the Families of Victims of Involuntary Disappearance (FIND), a human rights organization established at the height of the people's resistance to the Marcos dictatorship.*

*The cold-blooded murder of former Senator Benigno Aquino in August 1983 heightened the mass protests against the then moribund Marcos regime. As the people's resistance intensified, the suppression of civil liberties escalated as well. The convenient tool to silence dissent was the enforced disappearance of those arbitrarily labeled as "enemies of the State".*

*Uncowed by the declaration of martial law in 1972 and the unlawful arrests and detention, torture, cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment or punishment, and extrajudicial killings that continued beyond martial law, the progressive and principled, especially among the youth, courageously and resolutely fought against repression and the onslaught on human rights.*

*What did the disappeared have in common?*

1. *They shared a common vision of a society where no Filipino is hungry, ignorant, homeless, jobless, powerless.*
2. *They always put the interest of the people they have chosen to serve ahead of their personal interests.*
3. *They searched for the truth amidst the self-serving lies and falsehoods of those in power, and confronted the social and economic ills of the country on the basis of empirical facts.*
4. *They held government accountable for the highly skewed distribution of wealth and power, the rampant graft and corruption, the ballooning national debt, and the flawed agenda of change and development.*
5. *They lived with and for the poor and marginalized, teaching them to assert their rights amidst repression, learning from their innate wisdom, and dreaming with them of a future when no single drop of blood would color the land farmers till and when every drop of sweat from a worker's back would translate into a living wage.*

*It is indeed lamentable, that these desaparecidos were vanished without seeing the dawning of their dreams.*

*It is equally deplorable that the loved ones they left behind have been unable to mourn as they endlessly equivocate between hope of reuniting with their disappeared kin alive and despair of finding them lifeless and tortured, or unearthing their skeletal remains with ropes or wires wound around the neck, skull, ribs and limbs broken, lying beside spent bullets.*

*The traumatic loss endured by mothers, wives, children, and other family members manifest in lingering pain and anguish, anger, fear, anxiety, social withdrawal, isolation and even guilt of having failed to prevent the disappearance. All this leads to months and years of unresolved grief. This is aggravated by economic difficulties when the disappeared is the sole family breadwinner.*

*For instance, poor wives, who suddenly find themselves multi-burdened and struggling between resilience and depression, need psychosocial support and rehabilitation. It is for this reason that R.A. 10353 or the Anti-Enforced or Involuntary Disappearance Act of 2012, which the 15th Congress enacted, necessarily provides for a comprehensive rehabilitation program that is gender-responsive, human rights-based, and culturally sensitive.*

*Thus, it is incumbent upon government to accompany the survivors of enforced disappearance in their long journey toward truth, justice, comprehensive reparations, and non-repetition of the abominable crime to which they have fallen prey.*

*Under the current administration, however, there are roadblocks to their full recovery and reintegration into the mainstream of society. These include the brazen commission of extrajudicial killings of suspected drug dependents, drug pushers, and other criminals. The violent drug-and-crime-busting inevitably reminds them of the harrowing fate of their disappeared kin.*

*In the same vein, the proposed burial of the remains of the chief violator of human rights during martial law in the Libingan ng maging Bayani opens old wounds that have not really healed in the absence of closure as justice remains elusive.*

*Today as we mark the International Day of the Disappeared, I join the families of desaparecidos in urging Congress to exercise its oversight function to ensure that R.A. 10353 is fully and strictly implemented.*

*I also join them in urging the President to endorse the Philippines' accession to the International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance which entered into force nearly six (6) years ago. This landmark international human rights instrument complements and strengthens national legal protection from enforced disappearance and other forms of deprivation of liberty.*

*The Convention holistically and comprehensively addresses the global scourge of enforced disappearance beyond national borders. As a responsible and responsive member of the family of nations, it behooves the Philippines, where there are over 2,000 unresolved cases of enforced disappearance, to join the 96 signatories and 52 States Parties to the Convention.*

*Making the world enforced disappearance-free is a tall order that no single nation can attain. But, united, nations have progressively moved toward breaking impunity, upholding human dignity and protecting life and liberty.*

*Building peace based on human rights and justice is a long and arduous process. Serious efforts to reconcile national sovereignty and security with human rights and civil liberties toward peace-building are what international human rights and humanitarian laws seek. The Convention on Enforced Disappearance is indubitably one of these international human rights treaties. It is an enduring tribute to the desaparecidos and their families that the Philippines must affirm through accession.*

#### **REFERRAL OF REP. LAGMAN'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

Thereupon, on motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Lagman to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Bondoc, the Chair recognized Rep. Gary C. Alejano from Party-List Magdalo for his privilege speech.

#### **PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. ALEJANO**

In observance of the Armed Forces of the Filipino People Week (AFFPW) mandated under Republic Act (R.A.) No. 10664, Rep. Alejano spoke on the extraordinary services of the men and women of the armed forces who have relentlessly served the country and continue to fulfill their mandate as the protector of the people and the State, and secure its sovereignty and the integrity of its national territory.

He then informed his colleagues that his congressional office had initiated a two-day celebration of the event in the House and thereafter relayed the history of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) since its creation in 1935. He lamented however that in spite of the AFP Modernization Program, the AFP remained wanting in materials and equipment which has resulted in the death of an estimated 2,000 soldiers during the past ten years and a number of them wounded but psychologically scarred and traumatized. As such, he enjoined his colleagues to formulate a National Security Policy and Strategy aimed at achieving national security objectives with the available resources and making sure that the programs and projects of the Department of National Defense (DND) are in line with the stated capabilities of the military that need to be developed.

As he thanked President Rodrigo Roa Duterte for the release of the veterans' pension fund, Rep. Alejano proceeded to discuss the chosen theme in the current celebration of the AFFPW, which is "Honoring our Soldiers, Educating our People, and Inspiring our Youth."

In closing, he asked that the sacrifices and bravery of the soldiers be remembered not only in the last week of August every year but every day, and thanked the veterans, as well as the current and retired members of the AFP and their families for their fidelity to and sacrifices for the country.

At this point, Rep. Raul A. Daza sought recognition from the Chair.

#### **MOTION OF REP. BONDOC**

Rep. Bondoc however moved for the recognition of Rep. Salvador B. Belaro Jr. for his interpellation.

#### **QUERY OF REP. DAZA**

Rep. Daza however inquired whether Rep. Alejano would yield to his interpellation.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, the session was suspended at 5:03 p.m.

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 5:04 p.m.

#### **MANIFESTATION OF REP. DAZA**

Rep. Daza, after the explanation made by Rep. Bondoc, manifested to interpellate Rep. Alejano after the turn of the first interpellator, and which manifestation the Chair noted.

#### **INTERPELLATION OF REP. BELARO**

Recognized by the Chair, Rep. Belaro inquired whether the vast funds of the Philippine Veterans Bank (PVB) have benefitted the veterans throughout the country, and what legislative recommendations can be made to address the irregular inflow of funds to the veterans.

In response, Rep. Alejano referred to the hearing conducted by the House Committee on Veterans Affairs in the last Congress, where it was found out that the money remitted to the board of trustees of World War II veterans by the PVB was not sufficient and that the national government has no authority over the bank because it is governed by its own charter. He said that until now, the Committee's request for the legal opinion of the Solicitor General with respect to authority over said funds has not yet been acted upon and that there is a need for legislative discussions on the

issue. He said that another resolution that would look into said funds should be filed in the 17<sup>th</sup> Congress, as what they did in the last Congress.

Rep. Belaro, in reaction, manifested that it would be better for the PVB to live up to its name, and thanked Rep. Alejano for delivering a patriotic speech.

#### **INTERPELLATION OF REP. DAZA**

Recognized by the Chair on motion of Rep. Bondoc, Rep. Daza first commended Rep. Alejano for his timely speech. He thereafter stressed that he took the floor to insure that the Journal of the House would reflect that the military officer attire of Rep. Alejano is a proper attire, this as referred to the Provisional Rules of the House that the 17<sup>th</sup> Congress has adopted, defining the proper attire of a Member as barong tagalog, coat and tie, or business attire. He then asked that he be educated on the military rank as reflected on Rep. Alejano's military uniform, as well as the medals pinned therein. He explained that he would like to be educated on the matter, and also for the Journal of the House to reflect the attire which he opined was very proper.

After emphasizing that he requested the House leadership to allow him to wear his uniform in the last week of August to show support to the men and women in the armed forces, Rep. Alejano explained in detail the general office uniform of the Philippine Marine Corps which he joined as a member of the reserved unit, and which includes his name plate and his rank indicating that he is a lieutenant colonel, as well as the insignias, honorary badges and ribbons that were given or awarded to him while he was still in the active service.

After Rep. Alejano discussed his position on the ongoing peace talks between the government and the CPP-NPA-NDF, Rep. Daza thanked him for sharing them to the Body.

#### **REFERRAL OF REP. ALEJANO'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Alejano and the interpellations thereon to the Committee on Rules.

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.
