THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

With the unanimous consent of the Body, on motion of Rep. Gonzales (A.D.), the Chair declared a

Privilege Hour and thereafter, recognized Rep. Arnolfo "Arnie" A. Teves Jr. from the Third District of Negros Oriental for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. TEVES

Rep. Teves spoke on the issue of bashing on social media which he had brought up during a committee hearing and on the need to regulate the use of social media which does not mean restricting one's freedom of speech. Even as he has no problem with social bashing, he pointed out that what is more important to him is the identity and accountability of the social media account holders.

In this regard, Rep. Teves signified his intent to file a bill, for which he asked his colleagues' support, requesting social media companies to regulate and filter social media accounts. He added that under his proposed measure, a social media entity which cannot filter a malicious account, may be held equally accountable. He said that he became a victim of social bashing on Facebook recently from a group using the name "Nurses for Change Movement" after he suggested a ban against grumpy nurses in government hospitals.

REFERRAL OF REP. TEVES' PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Gonzales (A.D.), there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Teves to the Committee on Rules.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. ROCAMORA

Recognized by the Chair, Rep. Ramon V.A. "RAV" Rocamora from the Lone District of Siquijor spoke about the need to continue the past administration's program on participatory budgeting or bottom-up-budgeting (BuB) which is planned to be removed from the proposed 2017 national budget. He expressed gladness that many members of the civil society and local government officials spoke in defense of the BuB that eventually convinced the national government to give the program a second look including Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Secretary Ismael "Mike" Sueño who agreed to continue the projects that were products of exhaustive discussions and deliberations by communities. He hoped that the DILG will heed the sentiments of the local communities and local government units (LGUs) which want to continue the program.

Having been implemented for the past three years, he expressed belief that at such stage of infancy, the BUB should be continued and further strengthened

and expressed hope that the Executive led by President Rodrigo Roa Duterte would engage the civil society and the LGUs who are championing the Program. In case the Duterte Administration has reservations with its name and connection with the past administration, he suggested to rename it to Participatory Reform for Rural Development (PRRD). He expressed apprehension that discontinuing participatory budgeting would be a lost opportunity in the government's campaign to bring meaningful change to the lives of the people, especially the poor.

In view thereof, he said that he had filed House Joint Resolution No. 4 calling for the restoration of the P35 billion allotted fund for BuB in the proposed 2017 national budget and asked the support of Rep. Karlo Alexei B. Nograles, as Chair of the Committee on Appropriations, as well as the Members of the 17th Congress to support the approval of the Joint Resolution.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

At this point, Rep. Rocamora acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of his guests from Quezon and Batangas.

SUSPENSION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

With 237 Members responding to the Call, the Chair declared the presence of a quorum. (See also Appendix 1)

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Cayetano relinquished the Chair to Speaker Pantaleon D. Alvarez.

MOTION OF REP. FARIÑAS

Majority Leader Rodolfo C. Fariñas then moved that the Body consider on Third Reading House Bill No. 3504, printed copies of which were distributed to the Members on September 7, 2016 pursuant to Section 58, Rule X of the amended Provisional Rules of the House; and that the Secretary General be directed to read the title thereof and call the roll for nominal voting.

POINT OF ORDER OF REP. DEL MAR

Upon recognition by the Chair, Rep. Raul V. Del Mar stated that the Body could not have a final reading or voting of any bill unless copies thereof had been distributed three session days beforehand.

Majority Leader Fariñas said that three calendar days were required and not three session days; and that the Bill was distributed on September 7, 2016.

Rep. Del Mar opined that the House had always required three session days and not calendar days. He inquired how the Chamber could include a Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday when there were no sessions on these days and remarked that these were five calendar days but not session days. He urged the Body not to hurry with the Bill, violating the Rules because the Bill will be approved anyway and remarked that if it will be scheduled for voting the following day, the Body will approve it the following day without any question. He asked the Chamber not to violate all of the Rules just because it was in a hurry.

As he observed that his colleague did not cite a particular rule, Majority Leader Fariñas read into the records the second paragraph of Section 58 entitled “Third Reading”, to wit: “No bill or joint resolution shall become law unless it passes three readings on separate days and printed copies thereof in its final form are distributed to the Members three days before its passage.” He explained that the Bill was distributed on September 7, 2016; and it being September 13, 2016, six days had already passed. He stressed that what the Rules said was not session days but three days before its passage; and concluded that the Body had complied with the same.

Rep. Del Mar rejoined that the “three days” had always referred to session days as he asked how the Body could refer to calendar days which included

those days that it was not in session. He said that such was the requirement so that the Members could decide accordingly, would not be deprived of the opportunity to be given a copy of the measure three session days beforehand, and would have full information on what they would vote on.

RULING OF THE CHAIR

The Chair upheld the position of Majority Leader Fariñas.

APPROVAL ON THIRD READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 3504

With the Chair reiterating Majority Leader Fariñas' previous motion, there being no objection, the Body proceeded to the approval on Third Reading of House Bill No. 3504, printed copies of which were distributed to the Members on September 7, 2016 pursuant to Section 58, Rule X of the amended Provisional Rules of the House.

APPEAL OF REP. DEL MAR

Rep. Del Mar appealed the ruling of the Chair.

APPROVAL ON THIRD READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 3504

(Continuation)

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit: "AN ACT POSTPONING THE OCTOBER 2016 BARANGAY AND SANGGUNIANG KABATAAN ELECTIONS, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9164, AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9340 AND REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10656, PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL RULES GOVERNING THE CONDUCT OF BARANGAY AND SANGGUNIANG KABATAAN ELECTIONS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

REMARKS OF REP. DEL MAR

Rep. Del Mar maintained that the Members do not have a voice anymore and uttered it is really reprehensible.

APPROVAL ON THIRD READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 3504

(Continuation)

The Chair then directed the Secretary General to call the Roll for nominal voting. Thereafter, pursuant to the amended Rules of the House, a second Roll Call was made.

REMARKS OF REP. DEL MAR

Rep. Del Mar remarked that he would have voted "no" if the consideration of the Bill on Third Reading was not out of order.

REMARKS OF REP. LAGMAN

Rep. Edcel C. Lagman requested that he be allowed to explain his "affirmative" vote; and the Chair said that he could do so after the voting was finished.

With 218 affirmative votes, four negative votes, one who did not participate and no abstentions, the Body approved on Third Reading House Bill No. 3504.

QUERY OF REP. DEL MAR

As to how his vote was registered, the Chair informed Rep. Del Mar that he did not participate in the voting on Third Reading of House Bill No. 3504.

Affirming the same, Rep. Del Mar stated that he considered the voting on Third Reading of House Bill No. 3504 as out of order.

Thereafter, the Chair recognized Rep. Lagman.

EXPLANATION OF VOTE OF REP. LAGMAN

After he was informed of his affirmative vote, Rep. Lagman explained that he voted for the approval on Third Reading of House Bill No. 3504 for the following reasons:

1. The Constitution does not fix the terms of office of elected barangay as well as sangguniang kabataan (SK) officials;
2. The rescheduling of the barangay and SK elections from October 31, 2016 to October 23, 2017 is not an extension of their terms;

3. Incumbent barangay officials are entitled to the presumption of regularity in the performance of official functions as well as the presumption of innocence until the contrary is proven; and
4. There is no provision in House Bill No. 3504 that incumbent barangay officials, after October 31, 2016, can be replaced by those appointed by the President through the DILG.

TRANSMITTAL OF HOUSE BILL NO. 3504 TO THE SENATE

On motion of Majority Leader Fariñas, there being no objection, the Chair directed the Secretariat to immediately transmit to the Senate copies of House Bill No. 3504 which was just approved on Third Reading.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

Upon motion of Majority Leader Fariñas who invited the Members to attend an all-party caucus at the Makalintal Hall of the South Wing Annex building, the session was suspended at 5:35 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 5:36 p.m. with Deputy Speaker Cayetano presiding.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Thereupon, Rep. Gonzales (A.D.) acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Reps. Amado T. Espino Jr., Leopoldo N. Bataoil, Rocamora, Florida "Rida" P. Robes, and Harlin Neil J. Abayon III.

On motion of Rep. Gonzales (A.D.), the Chair suspended the session at 5:40 p.m.

The session resumed at 7:23 p.m.

CHANGE OF REFERRAL OF HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 334

On motion of Rep. Juan Pablo "Rimpy" P. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body reconsidered the referral of House Resolution No. 334, entitled:

"RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING JANELLE MAE FRAYNA OF LEGAZPI CITY, ALBAY, FOR BECOMING THE FIRST FEMALE GRANDMASTER OF THE PHILIPPINES," and changed its referral from the Committee on Youth and Sports Development to the Committee on Rules.

APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL

Likewise, on motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body approved Journal No. 20, dated September 7, 2016.

ADOPTION OF HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 334

On further motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body considered House Resolution No. 334, entitled: "RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING JANELLE MAE FRAYNA OF LEGAZPI CITY, ALBAY, FOR BECOMING THE FIRST FEMALE GRANDMASTER OF THE PHILIPPINES"; dispensed with the reading of the text thereof without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; and unanimously adopted the same.

RESUMPTION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

Subsequently, on motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body resumed the Privilege Hour and the Chair recognized Rep. Tom S. Villarín to interpellate Rep. Rocamora.

INTERPELLATION OF REP. VILLARIN

During their debate, Rep. Rocamora agreed with Rep. Villarín that certain provisions of the 1991 Local Government Code as cited by the latter apply to the bottom-up budgeting or BuB process because the essence of said approach is to bring the budget processes down to the municipal level. Both Members likewise agreed that the provision for additional funding under the BUB would definitely be of help to the LGUs.

Reps. Rocamora and Villarín also discussed the latter's concerns on the impact of institutionalizing participatory budgeting, and whether the BuB and the process of further devolution and decentralization would be complementary to a shift in a federal form of government

As to the performance indicators of the BuB program, Rep. Rocamora said that he would file a bill to institutionalize BUB wherein protection would be given against partisan politics. He added that with the participation of the community in coordination with

the LGUs, the civil society organizations (CSOs) are given assurance that they would be doing their function well and would not be beholden to or controlled by local executives.

As he and his colleague agreed that devolution and participatory budgeting will complement the concept of federalism, Rep. Rocamora opined that the people can address their own needs if only they are empowered.

REFERRAL OF REP. ROCAMORA'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Gerald Anthony "Samsam" V. Gullas Jr., there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. Rocamora's privilege speech and interpellation thereon to the Committee on Rules.

TERMINATION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Rep. Gullas, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.

MANIFESTATION OF REP. BROSAS

Upon recognition by the Chair, Rep. Arlene D. Brosas manifested her desire to be allowed to submit a written explanation of her negative vote on House Bill No. 3504. She said she came in later so she was not able to register her vote.

The Chair took note of the manifestation.
