THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

The day being a Monday, on motion of Rep. Vini Nola A. Ortega, there being no objection, the Chair declared a Privilege Hour and thereafter, recognized Rep. Greg G. Gasataya for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. GASATAYA

Rep. Gasataya initially recalled that the sugar industry collapsed in the 1980s when the United States stopped buying most of its sugar from the Philippines, resulting in hunger and death for thousands of sugarcane workers in Negros Occidental. He then explained that the sugar industry was again confronted with a similar challenge with the recent importation, sale, and use of high fructose corn syrup (HFCS) which was cheaper than locally-produced sugar. Citing statistics, he said that the entry of HFCS into the country for just three months in 2016 resulted in the dramatic drop in the price of sugar and in billions of revenue loss; and that this could eventually lead to poverty and hunger as well as turmoil and insurgency among industry stakeholders.

Rep. Gasataya then appealed to the Body to help the sugar farmers and workers as he said that he and 14 Members from sugar-producing provinces will file a Resolution calling for an inquiry on the importation of HFCS.

REFERRAL OF REP. GASATAYA'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Ortega (V.N.), there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Gasataya to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Ortega, the Chair recognized Deputy Speaker Bai Sandra Sinsuat A. Sema for her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF DEPUTY SPEAKER SEMA

In behalf of the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, Rep. Sema expressed support for the peace efforts of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte for the Bangsamoro people. As she cited peace negotiations that were still awaiting full implementation with the national government, she stressed the need to be patient even with perceived enemies and to trust and fully support the President who was a Mindanaoan and of Moro blood. She said that there would always be saboteurs to peace; the Bangsamoro people were always put in a bad light; and the road to peace could be bumpy and thorny but only after rising above the cloud of temptation could they see how clear peace could be.

REFERRAL OF DEPUTY SPEAKER SEMA'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Ortega (V.N.), there being no objection, the Body referred Deputy Speaker Sema's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules.

On further motion of Rep. Ortega, the Chair recognized Rep. Emmi A. De Jesus to deliver her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. DE JESUS

Adverting to the fire that razed the House Technologies Industries (HTI) factory in the Cavite Export Processing Zone (CEPZ) on February 1, 2017, Rep. De Jesus stressed that management was quick to estimate its damages but slow to fully account for its injured or dead workers, most of whom were contractuels. Speaking in Filipino, she said that the industrial fire showed that capital investment and property were more important than the lives and safety of workers;

there seemed to be special laws within special economic zones (SEZs) where unions and strikes were not allowed but contractualization was practiced; and the CEPZ did not have the capacity to respond to big fires and was skimping on the safety of its workers. She expressed Gabriela's call for a public investigation to determine the CEPZ's liability in the incident and the SEZs' compliance with occupational health and safety standards; a review of the Special Economic Zone Act of 1995; and justice as well as medical and financial assistance for the HTI fire victims.

REFERRAL OF REP. DE JESUS' PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Ortega (V.N.), there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. De Jesus' privilege speech to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Ortega, the Chair recognized Rep. Robert Ace S. Barbers to deliver his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. BARBERS

Rep. Barbers rose on behalf of the stakeholders of the mining industry in the light of Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Secretary Gina Lopez' recent decision to close several mining companies based on an audit which showed alleged environmental violations. He said that the latter, if true, could have been the result of years of neglect or tolerance of former DENR Secretary Ramon Paje and former Mines and Geosciences Bureau Director Leo Jasareno; and that the latter could have fed wrong information to Secretary Lopez. He inquired on the identity and qualifications of the MGB audit team, the parameters and dates of audit, the participation of mining firms during the audit, and the basis of the aforementioned decision. He explained the impact of said closure on the livelihood, income, and education of thousands of miners and their families; the non-arability of mined land, thus not being fit for planting other crops; and the effect of poverty on insurgency. He suggested that before closing the mining companies, Secretary Lopez should first develop her "green economy" project and employ displaced workers therein.

REFERRAL OF REP. BARBERS' PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Gullas, there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. Barbers' privilege speech to the Committee on Rules.

TERMINATION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

There being no other Member who wished to avail of the Privilege Hour, on motion of Rep. Gullas, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.
