ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Rep. Defensor acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Reps. Edcel C. Lagman, Tom S. Villarín, and Teddy Brawner Baguilat Jr.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:  
COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 47  
ON HOUSE BILL NO. 4727**

On motion of Rep. Defensor, there being no objection, the Body resumed consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 4727, as embodied in Committee Report No. 47 and reported out by the Committee on Justice.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT IMPOSING THE DEATH PENALTY ON CERTAIN HEINOUS CRIMES, REPEALING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9346, ENTITLED 'AN ACT PROHIBITING THE IMPOSITION OF DEATH PENALTY IN THE PHILIPPINES,' AND AMENDING ACT NO. 3815, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE 'REVISED PENAL CODE,' AND OTHER SPECIAL PENAL LAWS.”

Rep. Defensor stated that the parliamentary status was that the Bill was in the period of sponsorship and debate; and on his motion, the Chair recognized Deputy Speaker Fredenil “Fred” H. Castro to sponsor the same and Rep. Kaka J. Bag-ao to interpellate thereon.

**INTERPELLATION OF REP. BAG-AO**

Speaking in Filipino, Rep. Bag-ao stressed the importance of honoring the country’s commitments to international treaties and covenants such as the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR), and several protocols and United Nations resolutions on human rights and the death penalty. She added that the Philippines was the first country in Asia that abolished the death penalty and was presently the chair of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, and held a Generalised Scheme of Preferences Plus (GSP+) status with the European Union.

Deputy Speaker Castro said that treaties and agreements which contravene the Constitution could not be regarded as part of the laws of the land. He opined that the other signatories to the aforementioned treaties would understand that the Philippines will reimpose the death penalty in order to deter crime and protect the victims of heinous crimes. He stressed that the Constitution, which provided for the reimposition of the death penalty through Congress, will always prevail. He opined that it was the Executive Department’s duty to address the implications of the death penalty on the country’s GSP+ status.

**REMINDER FROM THE CHAIR**

At this juncture, the Chair reminded Reps. Bag-ao and Castro to address the Chair during the debate.

**INTERPELLATION OF REP. BAG-AO**

(Continuation)

Rep. Bag-ao then described the case of several death convicts to show the bias of the death penalty against poor and marginalized sectors. She also expressed concern about (1) prioritizing the death penalty instead of the root cause of criminality which was poverty, (2) the weak justice system which allowed prisoners to stay in airconditioned prison cells, and (3) the argument that the death penalty was a lesser evil than extrajudicial killings (EJKs).

Her colleague held that accused persons were protected in every step of the judicial process; underscored that heinous crimes should be punished and the government did not sponsor EJKs; and agreed that the Department of Justice should clean up the judicial system including the officials and employees therein.

**SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Defensor, the Chair suspended the session at 6:37 p.m.

**RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 7:28 p.m.

**TERMINATION OF THE PERIOD OF SPONSORSHIP AND DEBATE**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Chair terminated the period of sponsorship and debate on House Bill No. 4727.

**SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, the Chair suspended the session at 7:29 p.m.

**RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 7:29 p.m.

**MOTION OF REP. BONDOC**

Thereupon, Rep. Bondoc moved to proceed with the period of amendments.

**MANIFESTATION OF REP. DAZA**

At this point, Rep. Raul A. Daza manifested his desire to rise on a point of order.

**PERIOD OF AMENDMENTS**

There being no objection, the Body approved Rep. Bondoc's motion to open the period of amendments on House Bill No. 4727.

**SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, the Chair suspended the session at 7:30 p.m.

**RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

At 7:34 p.m., the session resumed and the Chair recognized Rep. Daza.

**POINT OF ORDER OF REP. DAZA**

Rep. Daza said that Rep. Bondoc could not move to close the period of sponsorship and debate. He read into the records Section 53 on "Second Reading and Debate" and Section 54 on "Motion to Close Debate" of the House Rules and pointed out that although three Members had already spoken in favor of House Bill No. 4727, the Body still had to give two Members the chance to speak against it.

**REMARKS OF REP. BONDOC**

Expressing respect for Rep. Daza as a veteran lawmaker, Rep. Bondoc explained that Reps. Castro, Vicente "Ching" S.E. Veloso, and Reynaldo V. Umali had already spoken in favor of the measure and more than two Members had already spoken against it. He said that it was in accordance with Sections 53 and 54 as well as Section 55 on "Cloture" and Section 56 on "Amendments" that he had thus moved to close the period of sponsorship and debate and to open the period of amendments on the Death Penalty Bill. He added that no Member had opposed the aforementioned motions.

Subsequently, Rep. Bondoc concluded that the parliamentary status was that the Body was in the period of amendments on House Bill No. 4727.

**RULING OF THE CHAIR**

The Chair adopted the position of Rep. Bondoc, citing Section 101 of the House Rules on "Point of Order."

**MANIFESTATION OF REP. ATIENZA**

At this point, Rep. Atienza manifested his desire to be recognized.

**REP. DAZA'S APPEAL FROM  
THE RULING OF THE CHAIR**

Rep. Daza appealed the ruling of the Chair and said that he was entitled to five minutes to explain it.

**SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, the Chair suspended the session at 7:38 p.m.

**RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 7:38 p.m.

**REP. DAZA'S APPEAL FROM  
THE RULING OF THE CHAIR  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Daza pointed out that the fundamental error of Rep. Bondoc was that he was equating an interpellation with a speech against. He reiterated Section 54 which provided for three "pro" speeches and two "anti" speeches as he stressed that an interpellation did not count for a speech.

**REMARKS OF REP. BONDOC**

Rep. Bondoc pointed out that a *turno en contra* was not mentioned in the Rules. He reiterated that the Body had already complied with the aforementioned sections and had met the requirement to allow two Members to speak against the Bill.

**MOTION OF REP. BONDOC**

Thereupon, Rep. Bondoc moved that the Body vote on the appeal of Rep. Daza.

**REP. DAZA'S APPEAL FROM  
THE RULING OF THE CHAIR  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Daza pointed out that it was another fundamental error to invoke Section 56 without a proper and valid motion approved under Section 54. He explained that Section 56 states that it will be after the termination of the period of debate that the Committee amendments will be considered.

**REMARKS OF REP. BONDOC**

Rep. Bondoc subsequently said that the parliamentary status was that Rep. Daza had appealed the Chair's ruling that the requirements to close the debate, as found in Sections 53 and 54, had been met;

and that the Body was ready to vote on the appeal. He explained that a "yes" vote will sustain the appeal while a "no" vote will defeat it; and said that the Majority was asking for a negative vote.

**MANIFESTATION OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza sought recognition by the Chair before the voting on the appeal.

**REMARKS OF REP. BONDOC**

Rep. Bondoc said that under Section 119 of the House Rules, the voting could not be interrupted.

**REMARKS OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza pointed out that the voting had not yet started and that he was questioning the interpretation of Sections 53 to 57 of the House Rules.

**VIVA VOCE VOTING ON  
REP. DAZA'S APPEAL ON  
THE RULING OF THE CHAIR**

Thereupon, the Chair called for a *viva voce* voting on Rep. Daza's appeal on the ruling of the Chair; and with the majority of the Members voting against it, the same was lost.

In accordance with the same, the Body proceeded to the period of amendments.

**MANIFESTATIONS/OBJECTION  
OF REP. DAZA AND ATIENZA**

During the voting, Reps. Daza and Atienza manifested their desire to be recognized by the Chair. Rep. Atienza also stated that he was raising an objection and that there was a serious misinterpretation of the Rules.

**TERMINATION OF THE PERIOD  
OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

There being no Committee amendments, on motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body terminated the period of Committee amendments.

**REMARKS OF REP. DAZA**

At this point, Rep. Daza said that he did not want a nominal voting.

**REP. BONDOC'S MOTION  
FOR SUBSTITUTION**

With the permission of the Chair, Rep. Bondoc then stated that copies of the substitute bill on House Bill No. 4727 were earlier distributed to the Members. Pursuant to Section 104 of the House Rules, he moved to amend the entire House Bill No. 4727 as contained in Committee Report No. 47 by replacing its entire contents with the substitute bill.

**REMARKS OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza said that he did not believe that there was a quorum on the floor.

**REP. LAGMAN'S OBJECTION TO  
THE MOTION FOR SUBSTITUTION**

Rep. Lagman objected to Rep. Bondoc's motion.

**REMARKS OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza said that they had been questioning the interpretation or misinterpretation of the House Rules.

**REP. LAGMAN'S OBJECTION TO  
THE MOTION FOR SUBSTITUTION  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Lagman reiterated his objection to Rep. Bondoc's motion to adopt the substitute Death Penalty Bill.

**REP. BONDOC'S MOTION  
FOR SUBSTITUTION  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Bondoc stated that his motion was in accordance with Section 104 of the House Rules which he read into the records. He asked the Body to vote on Rep. Lagman's objection to his motion to adopt the substitute Bill, and said that an "aye" vote will sustain the objection.

**OBJECTION OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza objected thereto and asked the Body to first establish a quorum before proceeding with the voting.

**MANIFESTATION OF REP. LAGMAN**

Rep. Lagman sought recognition by the Chair anew.

**OBJECTION OF REP. ATIENZA  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Atienza then clarified that he was not debating on the issue but was insisting that a quorum be established first before continuing the debate.

**REP. BONDOC'S MOTION  
FOR SUBSTITUTION  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Bondoc clarified that an "aye" vote, which the Majority was asking for, will affirm the substitution of the Bill contained in Committee Report No. 47 with the aforesaid substitute bill; while a "nay" vote will sustain Rep. Lagman's objection thereto.

**OBJECTION OF REP. ATIENZA  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Atienza said that he was objecting to Rep. Bondoc's motion.

**REP. BONDOC'S MOTION  
FOR SUBSTITUTION  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Bondoc said that the voting could not be interrupted and asked that the Body proceed therewith.

**REP. LAGMAN'S OBJECTION TO  
THE MOTION FOR SUBSTITUTION  
(Continuation)**

Rep. Lagman stated that the Body had not yet proceeded with the voting.

Then given five minutes to explain his objection, Rep. Lagman noted that copies of two drafts of the wholesale amendments to House Bill No. 4727 were circulated among the Members, denominated as (1) "Amended by the Committee on February 22, 2017" and (2) "House Bill No. 4727 as of February 22, 2017." He said that he was not aware of any Committee hearing held on said date to adopt amendments on the instant Bill and that the Chairperson of the Committee on Justice did not have the sole prerogative to introduce and effect Committee amendments unless he was authorized by the Committee to do so. He asked what the purpose of the so-called second draft was.

**MANIFESTATION OF REP. DAZA**

At this juncture, Rep. Daza sought recognition from the Chair.

### **REP. LAGMAN'S OBJECTION TO THE MOTION FOR SUBSTITUTION**

(Continuation)

Rep. Lagman then pointed out that the Committee's amendment by substitution was flawed, improper, and illegal because it did not have the concurrence of the Committee and because the latter did not hold a meeting in order to effect the same. He said that the Body should not railroad the Bill even if it was a retrogressive one because the hallmark of a deliberative assembly was to give free rein to extensive debates so that differing positions can be achieved. He held that the House leadership was in estoppel because it had circulated a calendar of interpellators who should be allowed to interpellate the Sponsors provided that a quorum was present.

### **MANIFESTATIONS/REMARKS OF REPS. ATIENZA AND DAZA**

Reps. Atienza and Daza simultaneously sought recognition from the Chair, but the latter said that the Body was in the middle of voting which could not be interrupted.

Rep. Atienza then said that he had not been given an opportunity to explain his motion, while Rep. Daza requested five minutes under the House Rules in order to explain his objection to Rep. Bondoc's motion for substitution.

### **REP. BONDOC'S MOTION FOR SUBSTITUTION**

(Continuation)

Rep. Bondoc stated that the parliamentary status was that the Body was about to vote on Rep. Lagman's objection to his motion for substitution. He maintained that the motion for substitution was in order. As regards his colleague's observation on the drafts of the substitute bill, he explained that the Committee Secretariat first came up with an erroneous first page of the substitute bill but later printed a correct version thereof.

Rep. Bondoc asked the Body to proceed with the voting and stated anew that an "aye" vote would sustain his motion on the substitution.

### **REMARKS OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza asked the Body to first debate on the motion to close the period of debate.

### **MANIFESTATIONS OF REPS. LAGMAN AND ATIENZA**

Reps. Lagman and Atienza sought recognition from the Chair.

### **VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REP. BONDOC'S MOTION FOR SUBSTITUTION**

Thereupon, the Chair called for a *viva voce* voting on Rep. Bondoc's motion for substitution; and with majority of the Members voting in favor of the motion, the same was approved.

### **MANIFESTATION OF REP. DAZA**

Rep. Daza manifested his desire to make a statement.

### **POINT OF ORDER OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza said that the Chair's decision was unclear and that he heard that the "nay" vote won. He moved for a division of the House, saying a nominal voting will determine whether a quorum existed.

### **REMARKS OF REP. BONDOC**

Rep. Bondoc stated that Rep. Atienza was wrong because the procedure in voting had not yet reached the stage of nominal voting. He read Section 115 of the House Rules which provided for a division of the House if the Chair doubted the result of the voting.

### **POINT OF ORDER OF REP. ATIENZA**

(Continuation)

For his part, Rep. Atienza read Section 116 of the House Rules which provided that nominal voting will be called upon motion of a Member and as long as the motion was duly approved by one-fifth of those present in a quorum.

Insisting on his objection to the motion to close the period of debate on House Bill No. 4727, he stressed that the Majority Leader did not respect the Rules which provided that three Members should speak for the measure, and two Members against it.

### **REMARKS OF REP. BONDOC**

Rep. Bondoc stated that his motion for substitution was upheld by the Chair and approved by majority of the Members.

**MOTION OF REP. BONDOC**

Thereupon, Rep. Bondoc moved that the Body proceed to the period of individual amendments.

**POINT OF ORDER OF REP. DAZA**

Rep. Daza sought recognition on a point of order.

**PERIOD OF INDIVIDUAL AMENDMENTS**

As previously moved by Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body opened the period of individual amendments.

**POINT OF ORDER OF REP. DAZA**

Rep. Daza manifested anew his intent to raise a point of order.

**OBJECTION OF REP. ATIENZA**

Rep. Atienza stated his continuing objection to the proceedings because it was not in accordance with the House Rules.

**SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, the Chair suspended the session at 7:55 p.m.

**RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 7:56 p.m.

**ADJOURNMENT OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, there being no objection, the Chair declared the session adjourned until four o'clock in the afternoon of Monday, February 27, 2017.
