#### ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

At this point, Rep. Deloso-Montalla acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Rep. Emmanuel F. Madrona.

#### PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY OF REP. ARCILLAS

Recognized by the Chair, Rep. Arlene B. Arcillas inquired on the status of House Bill No. 4982 or the SOGIE Equality Bill which she co-authored.

With the permission of the Chair, Rep. Deloso-Montalla said that it was already in the Calendar of Business; after which Rep. Arcillas expressed hope that the Body will immediately take it up on the floor.

#### SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair suspended the session at 4:23 p.m., upon motion of Rep. Deloso-Montalla.

#### RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:25 p.m. with Rep. Aglipay-Villar presiding.

#### THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

The day being a Monday, on motion of Rep. Juliette T. Uy, there being no objection, the Chair declared a Privilege Hour and thereafter, recognized Rep. Estrellita B. Suansing for her privilege speech.

#### PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. SUANSING (E.)

Rep. Suansing initially pointed out that the celebration of the Women’s Role in History Month coincided with the birth anniversaries of Mesdames Gabriela Silang and Rosa Sevilla Alvero, rebel leader and educator-suffragist, respectively; and that in his State of the Nation Address, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte had directed all agencies to implement the Magna Carta of Women. She added that despite the passage of laws providing equal rights, protection, and opportunities to women throughout the world, oppression still existed against them.

Rep. Suansing then pointed out that the aforesaid celebration was anchored on the commitment of “*malasakit at pagbabago*” or true compassion and real change as captured through the theme, “We Make Change Work for Women.” Accordingly, she asked the House to review laws, policies, and programs on the protection of women; be inspired by Mesdames Silang and Sevilla and advance and protect women’s rights; and empower women and join them in their daily struggle to put food on the table, defeat domestic violence, overcome discrimination, and perform their central function of providing hope to their families.

#### **REFERRAL OF REP. SUANSING’S (E.) PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

On motion of Rep. Uy (J.), there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Suansing to the Committee on Rules.

On further motion of Rep. Uy, the Chair recognized Rep. Sol Aragonés to deliver her privilege speech.

#### **PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. ARAGONES**

Rep. Aragonés spoke on the struggles and challenges that Filipino women faced regarding breast cancer. She cited statistics showing that it was the most common form of cancer in the country, it developed in one in every 13 Filipinas, and it resulted in death within five to 10 years; and that the Philippines had the highest breast cancer incidence and mastectomy rate in Asia.

Thereupon, Rep. Aragonés asked her colleagues to address breast cancer through legislation as she pointed out that it was preventable and treatable. Saying she had already filed a measure to institutionalize the early detection of breast cancer and to promote education thereon especially in the barangays, she sought the Chamber’s support for raising breast cancer awareness and patient education to promote the health and well-being of women. She emphasized that through actual policies, programs, and projects nationwide, the government should guarantee the health and wellbeing of low-income Filipino women who may not have access to the early detection and treatment of breast cancer.

#### **REFERRAL OF REP. ARAGONES’ PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

On motion of Rep. Uy (J.), there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Aragonés to the Committee on Rules.

#### **SUSPENSION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR**

On motion of Rep. Uy (J.), there being no objection, the Body suspended the Privilege Hour.

#### **ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS**

Rep. Uy (J.) then acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Rep. Villarica.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

At 4:59 p.m., the Chair suspended the session upon motion of Rep. Uy (J.).

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

At 5:00 p.m., the session resumed with Rep. Labadlabad presiding.

#### **ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS**

Rep. Rosanna “Ria” Vergara acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Speaker Alvarez and Rep. Uy (J.).

#### **RESUMPTION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR**

On motion of Rep. Vergara, there being no objection, the Chair resumed the Privilege Hour and then recognized Rep. Emi G. Calixto-Rubiano for her privilege speech.

#### **PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. CALIXTO-RUBIANO**

After citing the Women’s Day theme of “Be Bold for Change,” Rep. Calixto-Rubiano gave honor to all outstanding Filipino women or Pinays in their respective fields. In the category of “Gandang Pinay,” she cited several winners of international beauty contests in general and Ms. Maria Mika Maxine Medina in particular, who represented the Philippines in the recently concluded Ms. Universe contest that was held in Manila. Speaking in Filipino, she lauded Ms. Medina for being beautiful inside and out, being in the top six, and showing grace under pressure. She then acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of Ms. Medina and her family. Lastly, she said that she had filed a resolution for Ms. Medina’s outstanding representation in the pageant and for being a source of continued pride for Filipinos.

### **REFERRAL OF REP. CALIXTO-RUBIANO'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

On motion of Rep. Vergara, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Calixto-Rubiano to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Vergara, the Chair recognized Rep. Arlene D. Brosas for her privilege speech.

### **PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. BROSAS**

Citing statistics on the prevalence of poverty especially in the agricultural sector as well as the unemployed sector, Rep. Brosas said that it was from these ranks that women and children were found as the most vulnerable to abuse and gender violence. She stressed that the plight of women could not be separated from that of the citizenry as a whole that suffered from neoliberal policies such as privatization, liberalization, and deregulation.

Speaking in Filipino, Rep. Brosas enumerated the problems faced by women in the Philippines including (1) contractualization, inadequate wages, and insufficient social services – which had led them to find work abroad but only to be exploited or killed; (2) non-recognition of the agricultural sector and the conversion of agricultural land into non-agricultural purposes; (3) militarization; and (4) political killings, harassment, and persecution especially in lumad communities.

After citing particular violent incidents, Rep. Brosas emphasized the call for the resumption of peace negotiations between the National Democratic Front of the Philippines and the Philippine Government because it was the most opportune venue to demand the reversal of neoliberal policies and to implement socio-economic reforms. She added that International Women's Day was a result of the fight of women-farmers and -laborers for land, work, livelihood, rights, justice, and peace. She lamented the fact that the dismal, dreary, and worsening conditions that forced women to rise, protest, and revolt over a hundred years ago, still existed.

### **REFERRAL OF REP. BROSAS' PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

Thereupon, on motion of Rep. Vergara, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Brosas to the Committee on Rules.

### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

The session was suspended at 5:24 p.m., upon motion of Rep. Vergara.

### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session was resumed at 5:24 p.m. with Rep. Lorna C. Silverio presiding.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Florida "Rida" P. Robes, the Chair recognized Rep. Sarah Jane I. Elago for her privilege speech.

### **PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. ELAGO**

Expressing the solidarity of the youth in the observance of the International Working Women's Month and in the economic empowerment of the women's sector, Rep. Elago called for an end to labor contractualization. She explained that it made Filipino youth and women vulnerable to exploitation in the workplace, thus pushing them to further destitution. She emphasized that the fight against contractualization was a fight for women's labor rights.

As she thereafter urged the youth sector to continue working for its socio-economic, pro-reform, and pro-poor agenda, Rep. Elago asked it to join forces with the women's sector to continue the fight against State fascism. She also asked them to be inspired by the country's female heroines and achieve social change.

### **REFERRAL OF REP. ELAGO'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

Thereupon, on motion of Rep. Robes, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Elago to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Robes, the Chair recognized Rep. France L. Castro for her privilege speech.

### **PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. CASTRO (F. L.)**

Speaking in Filipino, Rep. Castro cited the women sector's continuing struggle for jobs, adequate wages, safe working conditions, social justice, and freedom from oppression. She said that the Constitution provided for the protection of the rights of women as well as for the recognition of their role in nation-building, but that the government had not fully addressed their problems especially in the workplace such as inade-

quate maternity benefits, job security, and low salaries and allowances. She held that the Duterte Administration had failed to address socio-economic problems and corruption; implemented anti-poor economic schemes and policies; nurtured a climate of violence in the name of its war on drugs; and committed political repression and human rights violations. She stressed that the cancellation of its peace talks with the National Democratic Front of the Philippines had placed the Comprehensive Agreement on Socio-Economic Reforms that sought to address the roots of armed conflict, in jeopardy.

Rep. Castro concluded that women will not be free as long as majority of them—who were in the farming and labor sectors—remained poor because of the prevailing colonial and feudal social system. She opined that women workers cannot only fight for gender equality but can be instruments in forging real change in a society where justice and peace prevail.

#### **REFERRAL OF REP. CASTRO'S (F.L.) PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

On motion of Rep. Robes, there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. Castro's (F.L.) privilege speech to the Committee on Rules.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Robes, the session was suspended at 5:42 p.m.

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 5:44 p.m.

On motion of Rep. Robes, the Chair recognized Deputy Speaker Pia S. Cayetano to deliver her privilege speech.

#### **PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF DEPUTY SPEAKER CAYETANO**

Rep. Cayetano's privilege speech focused on the problems faced by Filipino women because of prolonged denial of access to reproductive health services and information such as giving birth to many children despite poverty, suffering health issues before and during pregnancy, and getting pregnant in their teens. She pointed out that in turn, these problems have resulted in higher maternal and infant mortality rates, abortion, and sexually-transmitted diseases.

She said that while President Duterte as well as Speaker Alvarez both fully support the Reproductive Health Law, the implementation thereof was delayed because of the issuance of a temporary restraining order by the Supreme Court that restricted the Food and Drug Administration from granting certifications needed for the procurement and distribution of family planning products. She thereafter amplified the voice of millions of Filipino women and girls who needed access to their basic right to reproductive health.

#### **REFERRAL OF REP. CAYETANO'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

On motion of Rep. Robes, there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. Cayetano's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Robes, the session was suspended at 5:48 p.m.

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 5:50 p.m. with Rep. Villarica presiding.

#### **TERMINATION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR**

On motion of Rep. Deloso-Montalla, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.

#### **APPROVAL OF THE JOURNALS**

On further motion of Rep. Deloso-Montalla, there being no objection, the Body approved Journals No. 76 and 77, dated February 28 and March 1, 2017, respectively.

UNIVERSE PAGEANT AND BEING A SOURCE OF CONTINUED PRIDE FOR FILIPINOS"; dispensed with the reading of the text thereof without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; and unanimously adopted the same in consolidation with House Resolutions No. 729, 734, and 738.

#### **ADDITIONAL COAUTHORS**

On motion of Rep. Cecilia Leonila V. Chavez, there being no objection, all of the women legislators were made coauthors of House Resolution No. 816.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Rep. Deloso-Montalla, the session was suspended at 5:54 p.m.

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 5:56 p.m.

#### **ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUEST**

At this point, Rep. Deloso-Montalla acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of Ms. Medina.
