**BUSINESS FOR THE DAY:  
 COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 139  
 ON HOUSE BILL NO. 5159**

On motion of Rep. Francisco Jose F. Matugas II, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 5159 as contained in Committee Report No. 139 and reported out by the Committee on Health.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY HEALTH CARE SERVICE TO PATIENTS, FURTHER AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE BATAS PAMBANSA BILANG 702, AS AMENDED, ENTITLED 'AN ACT PROHIBITING THE DEMAND OF DEPOSITS OR ADVANCED PAYMENTS FOR THE CONFINEMENT OR TREATMENT OF PATIENTS IN HOSPITALS AND MEDICAL CLINICS IN CERTAIN CASES'.”

As copies of the Bill had been distributed to the Members, on motion of Rep. Matugas, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Matugas, the Chair recognized Rep. Angelina “Helen” D.L. Tan, M.D., Chairperson of the Committee on Health, for her sponsorship remarks.

**SPONSORSHIP REMARKS OF REP. TAN (A.)**

Rep. Tan cited the objective of House Bill No. 5159 of stopping the practice of hospitals and health facilities of demanding deposits and advanced payments for the treatment and confinement of patients. She informed the Body of the salient features, to wit: (1) increase in the penalties for the violation of the Anti-Hospital Deposit Law; (2) expansion of the definition of “emergency care” to include women in active labor and at risk of miscarriage or fetal distress; (3) a policy framework that prioritized life preservation; (4) a PhilHealth compensation package for hospital-advanced procedures and treatment; and (5) provision by the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) of assistance to indigents undergoing emergency hospital treatment.

**APPROVAL ON SECOND READING  
 OF HOUSE BILL NO. 5159**

Thereupon, on successive motions of Rep. Matugas, there being no objection, the Body terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; terminated the period of amendments in the absence of Committee and individual amendments; and approved House Bill No. 5159 on Second Reading through *viva voce* voting.

#### **WITHDRAWAL OF THE CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 761**

Thereupon, on motion of Rep. Matugas, there being no objection, the Body withdrew the consideration of House Resolution No. 761.

#### **APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 5152**

On successive motions of Rep. Noel, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 5152 calendared under the Business for the Day, as contained in Committee Report No. 137 and submitted by the Committee on Higher and Technical Education, requiring higher education institutions to report participation and program support expenditures in all college athletic programs; dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; adopted the Explanatory Note as the sponsorship remarks on the measure as concurred by Rep. Ann K. Hofer, Chairperson of the Committee on Higher and Technical Education; terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; terminated the period of amendments in the absence of Committee and individual amendments; and approved the same on Second Reading through *viva voce* voting.

On motion of Rep. Noel, the Chair then recognized Deputy Speaker Gwendolyn F. Garcia who rose on a question of personal and collective privilege.

#### **QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE OF DEPUTY SPEAKER GARCIA (G.)**

Rep. Garcia first adverted to the speech she delivered the previous year regarding the gross mismanagement of and drug raid in the Cebu Provincial Detention and Rehabilitation Center (CPDRC) under the term of Cebu Governor Hilario Davide III who was also its jail keeper. Stressing that the CPDRC was hailed all over the world when she was the governor of the province because of its ingenious rehabilitation program, she alleged that its current sad and sorry state was due to the incompetence of Governor Davide.

Subsequently, Rep. Garcia adverted to the February 28, 2017 drug raid in the CPDRC by a composite team from the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA), Philippine National Police (PNP), and Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) where prisoners were ordered to disrobe and gather in the jail quadrangle. She said that Amnesty International and other human rights groups, netizens, ordinary citizens, and Vice President Leni Robredo had denounced such action as cruel and inhumane and violative of the rights of prisoners. She stressed that Governor Davide gave said order as she asked what the latter was doing about the drug problem in the CPDRC since the first raid where drugs, drug paraphernalia, and other contraband items were confiscated from its inmates.

Thereupon, Rep. Garcia said that she had filed a resolution for an investigation thereon.
