At 4:58 p.m., the session resumed.

At this point, Rep. Gerald Anthony "Samsam" V. Gullas Jr. acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Reps. Manuel T. Sagarbarria, Jonas C. Cortes and all the other Congressmen from the Province of Cebu as well as the guests of Reps. Mark Aeron H. Sambar, Jericho Jonas B. Nograles, and Abdullah D. Dimaporo.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Rep. Gullas, the session was suspended at 5:05 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 5:16 p.m.

Thereupon, the Chair recognized Majority Leader Rodolfo C. Fariñas on a question of privilege.

QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE OF MAJORITY LEADER FARIÑAS

Majority Leader Fariñas submitted a report of the Ad Hoc Committee that conducted an inspection tour of the Western and Eastern Nautical Highways as the first part of Speaker Pantaleon D. Alvarez' highways inspection project. He explained that the Speaker wanted the House to be in the best position to review the budget proposals of all concerned agencies during the deliberation on the National Expenditure Program after the President's State of the Nation Address. He invited his colleagues to join the second part of the project on June 1-6, 2017 that involved the Northern Luzon Highways.

Presenting a video documentary on the tour that started on March 16, 2017, Rep Fariñas cited the participation of the House Committees on Transportation, Public Works and Highways, Tourism, and Health through their respective chairpersons; the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), the Philippine National Police (PNP); the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP); Philippine Ports Authority (PPA); Maritime Industry Authority (MARINA); Departments of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and Public Works and Highways (DPWH); and the GMA and ABC 5 media networks. He said that the House Sergeant-at-Arms provided security together with the PCG and AFP.

Subsequently, Rep. Fariñas described the Committee members' route through the provinces of Batangas, Mindoro Occidental, Aklan, Zamboanga del Sur, Bukidnon, Davao del Norte, Samar, and Quezon as well as the cities of Iloilo, Bacolod, Dumaguete, Dapitan, Davao, Tacloban, Butuan, and Legazpi; the various land and water transportation facilities that they availed of including the roll-on/roll off (RORO) ferries; the coordination and preparation made by local and national officials for the Ad Hoc Committee's arrival in their localities; inauguration of new and inspection of existing public infrastructure; meetings

held with various stakeholders; and personal social and spiritual experiences during their 12-day travel.

Rep. Fariñas emphasized that the purpose and importance of the inspection tour was to get a glimpse of the actual condition of roads in the country especially those in the Eastern Visayas region which needed immediate action and attention; understand the urgent needs of the different provinces, and promote tourism

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF CERTAIN HOUSE BILLS UNDER THE BUSINESS FOR THE DAY

On successive motions of Rep. Gullas, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading the following House Bills calendared under the

Business for the Day, as contained in various Committee Reports and submitted by the Committees concerned; dispensed with the reading of the texts of the measures without prejudice to their insertion into the Record of the House; adopted the Explanatory Notes as the sponsorship remarks on the measures as concurred by the Chairperson of the Committees concerned; terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; approved the amendments as contained in the Committee Reports, if any; terminated the period of amendments; and approved the same on Second Reading through *viva voce* voting:

1. House Bill No. 5349, as contained in Committee Report No. 185, and submitted by the Committee on Legislative Franchises, renewing for another twenty-five (25) years the franchise granted to Notre Dame Broadcasting Corporation under Republic Act (RA) No. 8109;

House Bill No. 5556, as contained in Committee Report No. 207, and submitted by the Committee on Legislative Franchises, extending for another twenty-five (25) years the franchise granted to Isla Communications, Co., presently known as Innove Communications, Inc., amending for the purpose RA No. 7372;
3. House Bill No. 5557, as contained in Committee Report No. 208, and submitted by the Committee on Legislative Franchises, granting Ignite Telecommunications, Incorporated a franchise to construct, install, establish, operate and maintain telecommunications systems throughout the Philippines;
4. House Bill No. 5558, as contained in Committee Report No. 209, and submitted by the Committee on Legislative Franchises, granting the Golden Nation Network Inc. a franchise to construct, install, establish, operate and maintain radio and television broadcasting stations within the Philippines;
5. House Bill No. 5559, as contained in Committee Report No. 210, and submitted by the Committee on Legislative Franchises, extending for another twenty-five (25) years the franchise granted to Ermita Electronics Incorporated, presently known as G. Telecoms Inc., amending for the purpose RA No. 8196;
6. House Bill No. 4136, as contained in Committee Report No. 211 and submitted by the Committee on Legislative Franchises, renewing for another twenty-five (25) years the franchise granted to Manila Broadcasting Company under RA No. 7816;
7. House Bill No. 5342, as contained in Committee Report No. 182 and submitted by the Committee on Social Services, regulating public solicitations and providing penalties for violation thereof, repealing for the purpose Act No. 4075, as amended by Presidential Decree (PD) No. 1564, otherwise known as the "Solicitation Permit Law";
8. House Bill No. 5350, as contained in Committee Report No. 186 and submitted by the Committee on Indigenous Cultural Communities and Indigenous Peoples, extending the period for indigenous cultural communities/indigenous peoples to exercise the option to secure certificates of title to their ancestral lands under Commonwealth Act 141, as amended, or the Land Registration Act 496, amending for the purpose Section 12 of RA No. 8371, otherwise known as "The Indigenous Peoples Rights Act";
9. House Bill No. 5513, as contained in Committee Report No. 223 and submitted by the Committee on Justice, adjusting the amounts or the value of property on which a penalty is based, and the fines imposed under the Revised Penal Code, amending for the purpose Act No. 3815, otherwise known as the "Revised Penal Code, as amended";
10. House Bill No. 725, as contained in Committee Report No. 198 and submitted by the Committee on Transportation, prohibiting the collection of fees from passengers for the use of sanitary facilities located in the land transportation terminals, stations, stops and rest areas; and
11. House Bill No. 5347, as contained in Committee Report No. 183 and submitted by the Committee on Housing and Urban Development, establishing a local government resettlement program that implements an on-site, in-city or near-city strategy for informal settler families in accordance with a people's

plan and mandating the relocating local government unit (LGU) to provide other basic services and livelihood components in favor of the recipient LGU, amending for the purpose Republic Act No. 7279, as amended, otherwise known as the “Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992.”

ADOPTION OF FINDINGS/RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 197

On motion of Rep. Gullas, there being no objection, the Body adopted the findings/recommendations contained in Committee Report No. 197, as submitted by the Committee on Cooperatives Development, on House Resolution No. 256, re: the non-compliance of the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) with Section 13 of the Joint Rules and Regulations implementing Articles 60, 61 and 144 Of RA No. 9520, otherwise known as the “Philippine Cooperative Code of 2008.”
