As copies of the Bill had been distributed to the Members, on motion of Rep. Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House.

Subsequently, on motion of Rep. Primicias-Agabas, the Chair recognized Rep. Ramon "Red" H. Durano IV, Chairperson of the Committee on Basic Education and Culture, to sponsor the measure.

SPONSORSHIP REMARKS OF REP. DURANO

Rep. Durano pointed out that the primary objective of the Bill was to have an educational system that was responsive to the needs of national development, through the implementation of a career guidance and counseling program at the secondary level. He stressed that students should be guided on how to proceed from high school based on their inherent capacity and skills, job opportunities, and tertiary and technical-vocational programs. Saying that the Bill was also passed in the Sixteenth Congress, he urged his colleagues to support the same.

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 5576

On successive motions of Rep. Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; terminated the period of amendments in the absence of Committee and individual amendments; and approved House Bill No. 5576 on Second Reading through *viva voce* voting.

BUSINESS FOR THE DAY: COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 227 ON HOUSE BILL NO. 5633

On motion of Rep. Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 5633 as contained in Committee Report No. 227 and reported out by the Committees on Higher and Technical Education, and Appropriations.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

"AN ACT PROMOTING UNIVERSAL ACCESS TO QUALITY TERTIARY EDUCATION BY PROVIDING FOR FREE TUITION AND OTHER SCHOOL FEES IN STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES AND STATE-RUN TECHNICAL-VOCATION INSTITUTIONS, STRENGTHENING THE UNIFIED STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE SYSTEM FOR TERTIARY EDUCATION, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR."

As copies of the Bill had been distributed to the Members, on motion of Rep. Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House.

Subsequently, on motion of Rep. Primicias-Agabas, the Chair recognized Rep. Ann K. Hofer, Chairperson of the Committee on Higher and Technical Education, for her sponsorship speech.

SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF REP. HOFER

Stating relevant facts and figures, Rep. Hofer explained how education contributed to economic productivity, individual prosperity, and how the state of tertiary education funds needed to be addressed. She pointed out that the aforecited Bill, which was a consolidation of 59 measures, would allow the country's poorest of the poor to have access to tertiary education through free tuition, subsidies, and loan programs. She encouraged her colleagues to approve the Bill so as to lift the poor and middle class sectors from poverty and elevate their economic status.

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 5633

SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF REP. SARMIENTO

Rep. Sarmiento said that the policy of the Land Transportation Office (LTO) to extend the validity of drivers' licenses from three to five years meant savings in money, time, and resources. He however stressed that it also meant exposing the public to the risk for a longer period of time, to persons who did not have the skills, knowledge, and proper frame of mind to ply the roads. He thus urged his colleagues to immediately approve the instant Bill to ensure that only competent drivers will be licensed by the LTO.

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 5648
