Thereafter, Rep. Alfred C. Delos Santos acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Reps. Marlyn “Len” B. Alonte and Kristine Alexie B. Tutor.

#### **APPROVAL OF JOURNAL NO. 14**

On motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, there being no objection, the Body approved Journal No. 14, dated September 2, 2019.

Subsequently, on motion of Rep. Juan Pablo “Rimpy” P. Bondoc, the Chair recognized Rep. Sharon S. Garin on a question of privilege.

#### **QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE OF REPRESENTATIVE GARIN (S.)**

Representative Garin exhorted her colleagues to join her in condemning the brutal murder of former Rep. Rodel M. Batocabe, as well as the recent court decision granting the petition to bail of his accused killer, despite the presence of strong evidence against the latter. She then called for an examination of laws for a just and speedy justice system, and asked the police to ensure the safety of the Batocabe family, the witnesses, and the conspirators currently in custody.

#### **INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

On motion of Rep. Josephine Veronique R. Lacson-Noel, the Chair recognized Rep. Jose L. Atienza Jr. who asked Representative Garin (S.)

if there was already a plan of action regarding the matter. Representative Garin yielded the floor to Rep. Alfredo A. Garbin Jr. who explained the legal action he had taken as the Batocabe family’s legal counsel. Representative Atienza then emphasized the power of Congress to act as a Body and address the ills of the Philippine justice system.

Representative Garbin then stressed that there should also be a public outcry against the judge who granted bail to the alleged mastermind of the Batocabe killing. He then discussed with Representative Atienza the steps that should be taken to improve the nation’s justice system, with the latter pointing out that Congress should issue a resolution unanimously condemning the distortion of the justice system in the country and expressed support for the former’s proposal to file a resolution on the matter.

Representative Atienza thereafter suggested that the Body adopt a resolution that very moment considering that they could suspend the provisional Rules of the House. Representative Garbin stated that he would abide by the decision of the House leadership.

#### **QUERY OF THE CHAIR**

The Chair inquired on the content of the resolution that would be filed.

With the permission of the Chair, Representative Garbin stated that the resolution, which Representative Atienza would like to be adopted that day, would condemn corruption in the country’s justice system. He said however that they do not have a draft copy of the resolution.

The Chair stressed that it would be more appropriate if the Body has a copy of the draft resolution.

#### **POINT OF ORDER OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA**

Recognized by the Chair, Rep. Elpidio F. Barzaga Jr. stated that the parliamentary status was that Representative Garin (S.) delivered a privilege speech and was interpellated by Representative Atienza. He stated that no motion has been made to suspend the provisional Rules of the House and for the adoption of a resolution. He then inquired whether an oral resolution was permissible under the provisional Rules of the House.

With the permission of the Chair, Representative Bondoc appealed to Representative Barzaga to let the discussion continue in order to allow the Members to ventilate their feelings about what happened regarding the case of the late Representative Batocabe.

#### **MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE BONDOC**

In this regard, Representative Bondoc moved to suspend in the meantime the provisional Rules of the House.

#### **REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA**

As he also manifested his desire to interpellate on the matter, Representative Barzaga stressed that the proper motion could be made after the interpellation as long as it is in accordance with the provisional Rules of the House.

#### **REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Representative Atienza stated however that the Rules of the House could be amended on the floor anytime. He then inquired on the opinion of the acting Majority Leader on the matter.

#### **REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA**

Representative Barzaga stated this was why he wanted to have a ruling from the acting Majority Leader.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

The Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 5:57 p.m.

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 5:58 p.m.

#### **POINT OF ORDER OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA (Continuation)**

Citing Rule XIV of the provisional Rules of the House, Representative Barzaga pointed out that Representative Atienza was not a member of the Committee on Rules and therefore, was not authorized to move for the suspension of the Rules. He stated that otherwise, there will be disorderly proceedings and enjoined his colleagues to observe the Rules.

#### **REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE BONDOC**

With the permission of the Chair, Representative Bondoc stated that he had moved for a suspension of the provisional Rules of the House and begged the indulgence of Representative Barzaga to let the interpellation of Representative Atienza continue after which he would be recognized for his own interpellation.

#### **SUSPENSION OF THE RULES OF THE HOUSE**

Thereafter, Representative Bondoc moved for the suspension of the provisional Rules of the House in order for the Members to ventilate their feelings on the matter.

There being no objection, the Body approved the same.

#### **MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

With the provisional Rules of the House having been suspended, Representative Atienza moved that the House issue a strongly worded resolution.

#### **POINT OF ORDER OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA**

Thereupon, Representative Barzaga pointed out that before a motion to suspend the Rules of the House can be acted upon, such motion must first be approved by two-thirds of the Members present. He subsequently clarified that if said rules was also being suspended.

#### **REMARKS OF THE CHAIR**

For orderly deliberations, the Chair reminded Representative Atienza to speak only once he is recognized.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

Thereafter, the session was suspended at 6:01 p.m. upon motion of Representative Bondoc.

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 6:03 p.m.

#### **WITHDRAWAL OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA'S MOTION**

Recognized by the Chair, on motion of Representative Bondoc, Representative Atienza withdrew his previous motion suspending the Rules

of the House and thereafter yielded the floor to Representative Barzaga for his interpellation.

#### **INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE BARZAGA**

On motion of Representative Bondoc, there being no objection, the Chair recognized Representative Barzaga who initially thanked Representative Atienza for yielding the floor to him and expressed his whole-hearted support to Representatives Garbin and Garin (S.) in denouncing the brutal murder of former Representative Batocabe and the recent court decision allowing the accused, Daraga Mayor Carlwyn Baldo, to post bail.

Representatives Garbin and Barzaga then discussed the reasons why the judge decided to grant such bail considering that the murder charge against Mayor Baldo is a capital offense and there was strong evidence of guilt as explained by Representative Garbin.

Representative Barzaga underscored that justice should always be served. Considering further the high cost of litigation, he then proposed to establish funds in support of the prosecution of the murder case filed by the family of Representative Batocabe.

The Chair, upon motion of Representative Bondoc, recognized Representative Atienza for his motion.

#### **MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Representative Atienza recognized the opinion and statements of Representative Barzaga, and subsequently moved for the suspension of the Rules of the House. He said that the filing of the resolution would follow upon the approval of the Body.

#### **SUSPENSION OF HOUSE RULES**

As previously moved by Representative Atienza and duly seconded by Representative Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body approved to suspend the provisional House Rules.

#### **MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Thereupon, Representative Atienza moved for the filing of a House resolution condemning the court decision on the release of the suspect in the murder of former Representative Batocabe. Representative Garbin seconded the motion.

#### **REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE CABATBAT**

Recognized by the Chair upon Representative Bondoc's motion, Rep. Argel Joseph T. Cabatbat expressed his support to the House resolution denouncing the killing of their colleague, as he also recounted his own ambush experience on February 13, 2018.

#### **REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Then upon motion of Representative Bondoc, the Chair again recognized Representative Atienza who requested Representative Garbin to draft the resolution incorporating their sentiments on the killing of former Representative Batocabe.

#### **APPROVAL OF THE MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

As earlier moved by Representative Atienza and duly seconded, there being no objection, the Body approved the filing of a House resolution on the matter.

#### **REFERRAL OF SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE GARIN (S.)**

On motion of Representative Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body referred the speech of Representative Garin and the interpellations thereon to the Committee on Rules.

#### **BUSINESS FOR THE DAY: COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 4 ON HOUSE BILL NO. 304**

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 304 contained in Committee Report No. 4 as reported out by the Committee on Ways and Means.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 22, 24, 25, 27, 28, 29, 30, 32, 34, 37, 38, 39, 42, 51, 52, 54, 56, 57, 73, 108, 121, 122, 123, 174, 176, 179, 181, 182, 183, 184, 185, 186, 187, 188, 189, 190, 191, 194, 195, 196, 197, 198, AND 199; AND REPEALING SECTIONS 127, 175, 177, 178, 180, 192, AND 193; ALL UNDER REPUBLIC ACT NO. 8424, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE NATIONAL INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1997, AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

As copies of the Bill had been distributed to the Members, on motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the records of the House.

Representative Singson-Meehan stated that the parliamentary status was that the Bill was in the period of sponsorship and debate; and on her motion, the Chair recognized Rep. Estrellita B. Suansing, vice chairperson of the sponsoring committee and a principal author of House Bill No. 304, to sponsor the measure.

#### **SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE SUANSING (E.)**

At the outset, Representative Suansing said that the proposed Passive Income and Financial Intermediary Taxation Act (PIFITA) aims to make taxes in passive income and financial intermediaries simpler, fairer, more efficient, and more competitive; and hence could address the issues with the current income tax system, such as high tax rates and complex taxation system and structure.

She also explained that the Bill aims to unify tax rates for pre-need, pension, and life insurance at two percent, and interests, dividends and capital gains at 15 percent; rationalize various nuisances related to taxes on documentary stamps; benefit the poor and middle-income class through net gain on savings and equitable imposition of taxes; and make tax treatment simple and neutral across financial institutions.

She stated that the Bill would likewise encourage capital market development by addressing its barriers; and introduce more competitive tax rates in international financial markets. She emphasized the much-needed tax reform so the country can attract more capital investments for infrastructure development, job generation, and an inclusive and sustainable economy.

#### **SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE GARIN (S.)**

Recognized by the Chair upon motion of Rep. Marissa Andaya, Representative Garin, also a vice chairperson of the sponsoring Committee, stated that Philippine taxation on the financial sector is complex and can be confusing since tax rates vary depending

on many factors and conditions. She also said that the Philippine tax rates on capital income remains highest in the region.

She emphasized that the PIFITA, which is the fourth package in the Comprehensive Tax Reform Program, would simplify the financial taxation system; neutralize tax treatment by reducing the number of rates of withholding taxes and removing distinctions, special rates and unnecessary exemptions; and institutionalize equity to all kinds of investors and savers. She added that House Bill No. 304 seeks to enhance and promote capital market development and tax proficiency, thus making the Philippines more competitive among ASEAN nations.

On motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, the Chair recognized Rep. Joey Sarte Salceda, chairperson of the Committee on Ways and Means, for his sponsorship speech.

#### **SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE SALCEDA**

Representative Salceda mentioned some of the highlights of the Bill: (1) simplifies tax administration and reduces the complexity in the taxation of financial sector by reducing the number of unique tax rates and bases; (2) increases the country's competitiveness by reducing tax rate on interest income; (3) seeks to benefit the middle-and low-income groups by lowering tax rate on interest income for regular savings and make income taxation more equitable as it would harmonize taxes on income from assets; (4) makes insurance products more affordable by lowering insurance tax; (5) fixes issues resulting from high rates and complicated system of documentary stamp taxes; and (6) improves tax base by looking into existing tax exemptions and special rates on passive income.

In closing, he sought the support of the Members and their prompt action on the measure.

#### **SUSPENSION OF CONSIDERATION ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 304**

On motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, there being no objection, the Body suspended the consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 304.

Likewise, on motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, there being no objection, the Body resumed consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 4157 contained in Committee Report No. 2 as submitted by the Committees on Ways and Means, and Appropriations.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 4, 5, 20, 22, 27, 28, 34, 40, 50, 73, 112, 117, 204, 222, 237, 237-A, 255, 256, 257, 258, 261, 263, 264, 266, 275, 290, 291, 292 AND ADDING NEW SECTIONS 6-A, 282-A, 293, 294, 295, 296, 297, 298, 299, 300, 301, 302, 303, 304, 305, 306, 307, 308, 309, 310, 311, 312, 313, 314, 315 AND 316 ALL UNDER THE NATIONAL INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1997, AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

Representative Singson-Meehan stated that the parliamentary status of the Bill was that it was in the period of sponsorship and debate; and upon her motion, the Chair recognized Representative Salceda, chairperson of the primary sponsoring Committee, and Representative Atienza for sponsorship and interpellation, respectively.

**SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Representative Salceda, the Chair suspended the session at 6:46 p.m.

**RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 6:46 p.m.

Upon resumption of session, on motion of Representative Bondoc, the Chair recognized Representative Suansing (E.), vice chairperson of the Committee on Ways and Means, to answer the questions of Representative Atienza.

**INTERPELLATION OF  
REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Representative Atienza first clarified about the inclusion of a provision on franchising in the Bill, and questioned it given that the Bill is about amending the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC).

**SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

On motion of Representative Atienza, the Chair suspended the session at 6:55 p.m.

**RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

The session resumed at 6:56 p.m.

**INTERPELLATION OF  
REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA  
(Continuation)**

The Sponsor explained that the Bill intends to repeal certain tax provisions covered under certain franchise laws.

*At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Pimentel relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Aurelio “Dong” D. Gonzales Jr.*

Representative Atienza said that at the proper time, he would be proposing some amendments such as changing the wordings of the Bill if granting a franchise is not a subject provision of the measure. Representative Suansing then promised to provide him with a copy of the pertinent provision.

Subsequently, Representative Atienza discussed his concern on the possible success of the proposed Corporate Income Tax and Incentives Rationalization Act or CITIRA in improving job creation and the economy by making the country more competitive in view of the seemingly gradual lowering of corporate income tax (CIT). He also expressed apprehension about the relocation of companies and layoff of workers.

Representative Suansing, however, allayed his fears; clarified that the Committee was not removing the incentive system but merely fixing the process and placing time limits thereto; and affirmed that the stakeholders were consulted in hundreds of meetings and public hearings.

Representative Atienza then asked if a comprehensive study had been done on the impact of the CITIRA to relevant stakeholders and their position on the Bill. This, as he relayed his concern that the Bill would be fixing a system that is already working. He was also concerned about the implementation of CITIRA in terms of tax revenue collections, citing the issue of the non-implementation of the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA).

Representative Suansing advised Representative Atienza to get in touch with the Secretary of Finance in next week's committee hearing on the proposed Department of Finance (DOF) budget to discuss the matters he raised. She also committed to provide Representative Atienza a copy of two studies on the measure which looked into the respective positions and conditions of its stakeholders.

#### **MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN**

Recognized by the Chair, on motion of Rep. Lianda B. Bolilia, Rep. Edcel C. Lagman manifested his intent to interpellate on the Bill after Rep. Rufus B. Rodriguez and the other Members who registered for interpellation were through.

#### **MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE BONDOC**

Thereupon, Representative Bondoc informed the Body that the Committee on Rules has given the Members ample time to interpellate and urged them to take advantage of that opportunity especially that the Sponsors were present at that moment. He stressed that the lack of Members on the floor did not imply disinterest on the Bill but a sign of their agreement on the measure.

#### **MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN**

Representative Lagman underscored that he will interpellate the Sponsor at the proper time. Representative Bondoc took note of Representative Lagman's manifestation but reiterated that they had satisfied the requirements under the House Rules and would not yet close the debate on the Bill.

#### **SUSPENSION OF SESSION**

At this point, the session was suspended at 7:57 p.m. upon motion of Representative Bondoc.

#### **RESUMPTION OF SESSION**

At 7:57 p.m., the session resumed.

#### **INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE RODRIGUEZ**

Upon recognition by the chair, Representative Rodriguez said that the Joint Foreign Chambers of the Philippines had sent a position paper proposing for the exemption of the Philippine Economic Zone

Authority (PEZA) from CITIRA, contrary to the statement of Representative Salceda that various foreign chambers of industry in the Philippines had been consulted and somehow agreed on the Bill.

Thereafter, he presented the position papers of the Philippine Ecozones Association and the IT-Business Process Management Industry, which likewise object to the proposed tax regime as it would negatively affect investments and competitiveness of the country whereas such industries and ecozones greatly contribute to job creation, increase in investments, and hence, economic growth.

In response, Representative Salceda explained that certain industry groups were indeed consulted and that the Sponsors had tried to address many of their concerns. However, he said that he felt insulted by the accusations that he was not telling the truth and narrated the process that took place for the version of said Bill to be approved by the President and the different sponsoring committees in the previous Congress. He stressed that CITIRA is what is good for the country and the people.

Subsequently, Representative Rodriguez went on to discuss what could be a breach of agreement with foreign locators on the grant of incentives, and that this and any change thereto would violate the constitutional provision on impairment of contracts.

#### **REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE BONDOC**

At this point, Representative Bondoc reminded Representative Rodriguez to wrap up his interpellation as he has already gone over his time limit.

#### **INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE RODRIGUEZ (Continuation)**

Representative Rodriguez then proceeded to discuss the prospectivity principle of taxation in contrast to the retroactive taxation proposed under the Bill, which could affect the credibility of the country in terms of keeping its obligations.

#### **SUSPENSION OF CONSIDERATION ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 4157**

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Bondoc, there being no objection, the Body suspended consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 4157.

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 300 contained in Committee Report No. 3 as reported out by the Committees on Economic Affairs, and Trade and Industry.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 4 AND 8 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7042, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE 'FOREIGN INVESTMENTS ACT OF 1991'.”

As copies of the Bill had been distributed to the Members, on motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the records of the House.

Upon motion of Representative Singson-Meehan, the Chair recognized Representative Garin (S.), chairperson of the Committee on Economic Affairs, to sponsor the measure.

**SPONSORSHIP SPEECH  
OF REPRESENTATIVE GARIN (S.)**

Representative Garin explained that based on a study of 69 economies, the Philippines was found to be the most restrictive to foreign direct investments thus the need to revisit certain laws, especially the Foreign Investments Act. She pointed out that House Bill No. 300 proposes the updating of the Foreign Investment Negative List to exclude practice of professions and the lowering of local employment requirements to foreign investors.

In closing, she expressed the belief that the proposed amendments under the Bill would improve the competitiveness of the Philippine workforce and boost the country’s performance.

**SPONSORSHIP REMARKS  
OF REPRESENTATIVE RODRIGUEZ**

On motion Representative Bondoc, the Chair recognized Representative Rodriguez who cited the increase in the country’s foreign direct investments in recent years. He urged his fellow Members to support the government in its efforts to continue this improvement. He believed that this Bill would attract productive investments which in turn would facilitate transfer of technology and improvement of the Filipino workforce and consumers.

He then ended his sponsorship remarks saying that as coauthor of the Bill, he would no longer interpellate.

On motion of Representative Bondoc, the Chair next recognized Rep. Alyssa Sheena P. Tan, CPA for her sponsorship speech.

**SPONSORSHIP SPEECH  
OF REPRESENTATIVE TAN (A.S.)**

Representative Tan said that House Bill No. 300 aims to exclude the practice of professions from the coverage of the Foreign Investments Act of 1991 and

to reduce the number of direct local hires required by said law. The benefits thereof, she said, are the entry of technology and know-how from abroad; domestic job creation in businesses requiring highly-skilled professionals; and less labor costs for small and medium-sized enterprises.


YEARS OF CONTINUOUSLY PROVIDING MEANINGFUL, EDUCATIONAL, AMUSING AND ENTERTAINING WORKS OF ART WHICH REMAIN TO BE THE HALLMARKS OF THE LOCAL FILM INDUSTRY"; dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the records of the House; and unanimously adopted the same.
