

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This measure seeks to establish a manpower training and youth center in Barangay Don Bosco, Parañaque City to be known as the Barangay Don Bosco, Parañaque City Manpower Training and Youth Center. The proposed center shall be a place of learning for the youth and other residents (particularly the out-of-school youth and those coming from low-income families) of Barangay Don Bosco. The center shall serve as a place where the youth could obtain or upgrade relevant skills and competencies in technical-vocational occupation and trades.

The youth play a significant role in nation-building—and in this regard, it is incumbent upon the State to ensure that the youth can become fully productive members of the community. This measure aims to assist the residents of Barangay Don Bosco in acquiring practical livelihood, employable skills, gainful employment, and entrepreneurial capabilities. This center would allow for the development of skilled manpower in Don Bosco, which in turn could help to achieve a robust and inclusive economy in the host area.

On behalf of the people of Parañaque City's Second District, and for the common good of the Filipino people, the approval of the said measure is earnestly sought.

AN ACT
ESTABLISHING THE TECHNICAL EDUCATIONAL AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT
AUTHORITY (TESDA) MANPOWER TRAINING AND YOUTH CENTER
BARANGAY DON BOSCO, PARAÑAQUE CITY, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS
THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. – The act shall be known as the “Barangay Don Bosco, Parañaque City TESDA Manpower Training and Youth Center Act”.

SEC. 2. Establishment. – There is hereby established a Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) manpower training and youth center in Barangay Don Bosco, Parañaque City under the supervision of the TESDA, to be known as the Barangay Don Bosco, Parañaque City TESDA Manpower Training and Youth Center. It shall be established in a highly accessible location in Barangay Don Bosco, Parañaque City, pursuant to the purposes of this Act, and to the agreement between of the TESDA and the concerned local government units (LGUs).

SECTION 3. Appropriations. – The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) shall allocate the amount of one hundred million pesos (P 100M) for the construction of this center in Barangay Don Bosco.

SECTION 4. The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) shall help administer the center. It shall allocate the initial amount of thirty million pesos (P30M) for the procurement of the needed equipment and machinery or tools of the manpower center. Subsequent allocations shall be charged to the annual appropriations of (TESDA) in the General Appropriations Act.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. – If, for any reason, any provisions of this Act or the application of such provision to any person, group, and circumstance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act shall not be affected by such declaration.

SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. – The provision of this, as amended and all other laws, decrees, executive order, rules and regulations, issuances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provision of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. – This law shall take effect immediately after its publication in the Official Gazette.
