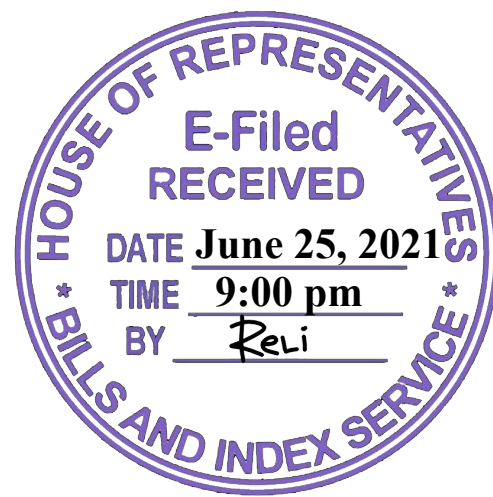

WHEREAS, Atty. Caridad Josefina Roa Valdehuesa passed away on the 3rd of June 2021 at the age of 88;

WHEREAS, Atty. Valdehuesa led the Bureau of Treasury as its 20th National Treasurer from June 1993 until July 1998;

WHEREAS, Atty. Valdehuesa left a legacy of service and innovation in the Bureau of the Treasury. She institutionalized various programs towards the development of the Bureau—from improving the investment process towards transparency and rationalization, to adopting automation and use of ICT technology to modernize the processes in the issuance, servicing, and settlement of government debt, Treasury Bills, and Treasury Bond;

WHEREAS, she also worked for the Central Bank of the Philippines for more than three decades and served as a Central Bank Managing Director;

WHEREAS, she was an honorable public servant who respected the rules. She stood up to corrupt practices without fear of losing her job. She was known to have returned bribes during her time in public service;


