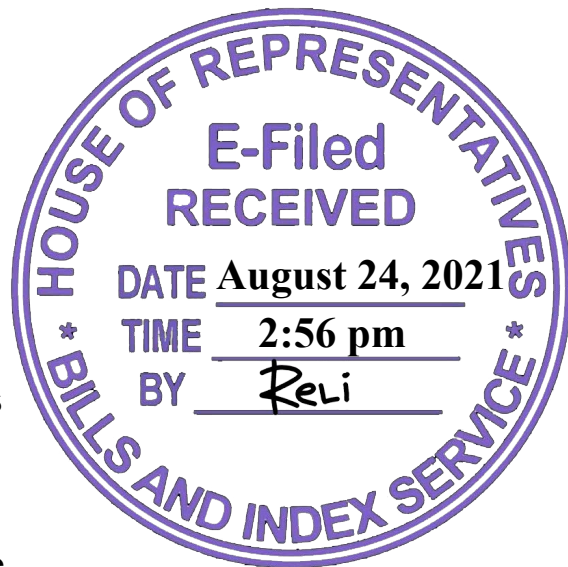

**A RESOLUTION
CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING NESTHY ALCAYDE PETECIO FOR
WINNING A SILVER MEDAL IN THE TOKYO 2020 OLYMPICS WOMEN'S
BOXING FEATHERWEIGHT COMPETITION**

WHEREAS, Petecio's silver medal finish is a milestone for her and the Philippines which is in the middle of its best performance yet in the Olympics;

WHEREAS, Nesthy Petecio settled for silver in the Tokyo Games Women's Featherweight finals on Tuesday, 03 August 2021, at the Kokukogan Arena, but the feat still made her the first Filipina boxer to win an Olympic medal.

WHEREAS, Petecio the pride of Davao del Sur turned it into a very close fight in the second round as she managed to get the nod of four (4) judges;

WHEREAS, Nesthy's win is also the Philippines' first medal in boxing since Anthony Villanueva and Onyok Velasco nabbed one (1) silver each in the

1964 and 1996 Summer Games in Tokyo, Japan and Atlanta, USA, respectively;

WHEREAS, being the first Filipino female boxer to secure an Olympic medal, Petecio would also receive free unlimited flights from Philippine Airlines and Cebu Pacific Air. Malaysian budget carrier, AirAsia, also rewarded her with five-year unlimited flights;

WHEREAS, Not only Petecio will savor her victory as Nestea Philippines pledged Nestlé products for her hometown in Santa Cruz, Davao del Sur and her chosen non-government organization.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby RESOLVED, to express our sincere congratulations and commendation to Ms. Nesthy A. Petecio for winning a Silver Medal in the Tokyo 2020 Olympics Women's Boxing Featherweight competition.

RESOLVED FURTHER, a copy of this Resolution be furnished to Nesthy Petecio.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that this Resolution be published in the Official Gazette of the Republic of the Philippines.
