PRIVILEGE HOUR

With leave of the House, on successive motions of Representative Nieto, there being no objection, the Chair declared a Privilege Hour, and thereafter recognized Rep. Manuel Jose “Mannix” M. Dalipe to deliver his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE DALIPE

Representative Dalipe stood to honor Hidilyn Diaz, his fellow Zamboangueño and the Philippines’ first-ever Olympic gold medalist.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Gatchalian relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Divina Grace C. Yu.

Recalling how Hidilyn bagged the silver medal during the 2016 Rio Olympics as well as her sacrifices for the Olympic gold, he said that Hidilyn has uplifted Filipinos amidst trying times, thus, he filed House Resolution No. 1984, commending and congratulating the former for winning the Philippines' first-ever Olympic gold medal in the Tokyo Olympic Games.

He then thanked Speaker Lord Allan Jay Q. Velasco, Majority Leader Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez, and Minority Leader Joseph Stephen "Caraps" S. Paduano for their congratulatory messages and commendations; Deputy Speaker Michael L. Romero, PhD, Mr. Ramon S. Ang, and Mr. Manny V. Pangilinan for their financial pledges; and his colleagues for filing resolutions congratulating Hidilyn.

Subsequently, he relayed that he is in agreement with his colleagues who are pushing for Hidilyn's spot promotion in the Philippine Air Force; joined the calls of Rep. Juan Fidel Felipe F. Nograles and Deputy Speaker Marlyn "Len" B. Alonte to bestow the Congressional Medal of Excellence to Hidilyn; and supported Deputy Speaker Camille A. Villar's resolution urging President Rodrigo Roa Duterte to confer Hidilyn the Philippine Legion of Honor.

As vice-chairperson of the Committee on Appropriations, he ensured that national athletes will have a voice in the House. He then enjoined Congress to continue providing the necessary support to the Philippine Sports Commission and the Philippine Olympic Committee, and to approve significant policies that will uplift the plight of Filipino athletes; and conveyed his unending support for all the Filipino athletes in the Tokyo Olympics.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE DALIPE

Thereupon, on successive motions of Representative Nieto, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Dalipe's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action and thereafter, the Chair recognized Minority Leader Paduano for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF MINORITY LEADER PADUANO

After congratulating Hidilyn Diaz for winning the country's first-ever Olympic gold medal, Minority

Leader Paduano, in his contra-State of the Nation Address (SONA) speech, stated that the country is in a very bad shape.

Speaking first about the government's pandemic response, he talked about the 1) economic crisis due to the pandemic and government-imposed lockdowns; 2) rising COVID-19 cases; 3) insufficient, slow, and alleged corruption-tainted distribution of financial subsidies; 4) delayed benefits of health workers; 5) delayed delivery, and lack of vaccine supplies; 6) high vaccine hesitancy rate among Filipinos; and 7) inequitable distribution of vaccines. He mentioned that the government needs to strengthen the free COVID-19 testing programs, and consider the effect of the Balik Probinsya Program. He also urged citizens to take extra caution while still waiting for the vaccines to become available to everyone.

He thereafter noted that the Duterte administration had succeeded in reducing the drug menace, lowering the crime rate, and neutralizing big drug personalities; however, he remarked that impunity and police abuses were downsides of the said campaign. He also mentioned the lack of coordination and even competition among law enforcement agencies. With the improvement in the salaries and benefits of uniformed personnel, particularly the Philippine National Police, he said that the public expects them to pay back through honest and dedicated work.

As regards food security and agriculture, he critiqued the policies on rice importation which favor importers rather than local producers.

Subsequently, he talked about the education sector, particularly the poor quality of learning materials, lack of gadgets for online learning, and the country's poor performance as reflected in the results of various international education assessment programs.

He then discussed the Administration's infrastructure development programs, pointing out, among others, the delays in the implementation thereof due to problems in the acquisition of right-of-way, and deficits in technical capacity. He stressed that while the President heralded his administration's infrastructure accomplishments, the latter admitted to the failure of rebuilding Marawi City; and added that, considering the ongoing pandemic, even the touted Build, Build, Build program would be left unfinished by the end of the latter's term.

After citing the inequitable distribution of infrastructure funds in favor of the National Capital

Region and Luzon, Minority Leader Paduano proceeded to critique the current administration's peace initiatives including the alleged misuse of funds in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, and National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict. He also urged the government to adopt a clear-cut and consistent foreign policy.

In conclusion, he called on the Legislature, the Executive, and local government units to, among others: 1) ensure the vaccination of all Filipinos, and implement an equitable distribution of vaccines; 2) investigate the involvement of police generals in drug activities; 3) cancel the executive orders on increased pork imports and reduced tariffs on imported rice and pork; 4) punish those guilty of negligence, dereliction of duty, and anomalies in the education sector and use special education funds to build infrastructure for distance learning; 5) complete infrastructure projects sans political motives, ensure the equitable allocation of public resources, and expedite the rehabilitation of Marawi City; and 6) adopt an independent foreign policy including a concrete and clear stand on the Visiting Forces Agreement, and the international arbitral ruling on the West Philippine Sea.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF MINORITY LEADER PADUANO

On motion of Rep. Michael Edgar Y. Aglipay, there being no objection, the Body then referred Minority Leader Paduano's speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

EXTENSION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On successive motions of Representative Aglipay, there being no objection, the Body extended the Privilege Hour for one more hour; and the Chair thereafter recognized Rep. Edcel C. Lagman for his privilege speech via Zoom videoconferencing.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN

Representative Lagman initially congratulated Minority Leader Paduano for his critical assessment of President Duterte's last SONA, and thereafter proceeded to relay his own counter-SONA.

He first stated that the following negative indicators show what ails the economy: 1) decelerating gross domestic product (GDP); 2) runaway

unemployment, and delayed, insufficient, and irregularity-laden cash aid distribution; 3) increasing poverty and hunger; 4) rising inflation; 5) ballooning national debt; and 6) problematic COVID-19 loans to which he called on the government to make a full accounting of the sources and uses of COVID funds. Adding that while the President was partly correct in blaming the pandemic for the sluggish performance of the economy, Representative Lagman said that the former overlooked that the GDP growth has decelerated even before the pandemic.

Representative Lagman next noted the President's silence as regards basic education amid the latter's loud pronouncements on the completion of mega infrastructure projects. He added that while the President has underscored the enactment of the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act, the latter has failed to address basic education needs, citing the dismal performance of the country in three international education assessments and refuting the latter's remark that poverty is the cause thereof.

Next, Representative Lagman said that the President has failed miserably in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic as shown by the 1) inordinate rise in the number of COVID-19 cases; 2) low percentage of fully vaccinated citizens; and 3) country's poor performance as assessed by different foreign and local media outfits, analysts, and economists.

On the state of the International Criminal Court (ICC) investigation, Representative Lagman said that the President does not only continue to evade the jurisdiction of ICC but also defies the Supreme Court (SC) in its unanimous decision which, among other matters, upholds the jurisdiction of ICC over the alleged offenses of the President and his men for crimes against humanity and other atrocities during his war on drugs. He also rejected the President's posturing that the country's withdrawal from the Rome Statute, which created the ICC, ousted the ICC's jurisdiction over him.

Representative Lagman then cited the country's low ranking in the 2021 World Press Freedom Index, the President's inclusion in the list of 37 world leaders branded as press freedom predators, and the latter's alleged attacks on various local media personalities and outlets.

He then deplored the current dismal human rights transgressions such as extrajudicial killings,

repressive policies, harassments, and summary executions of human rights defenders.

On corruption, Representative Lagman pointed out the country's poor ranking in the 2020 Corruption Perception Index, and called out the President for his statement that no one can stop corruption, noting the latter's earlier pronouncement that he would end corruption in government.

On the drug menace, Representative Lagman said that it is ironic that the President's centerpiece program — the elimination of the drug menace — would be his setback. Although the President has repeatedly admitted that his drug war has failed early into his administration, Representative Lagman said that the anti-drug campaign continues to be waged violently.

In closing, he held that what President Duterte failed to accomplish or fulfill in five years cannot be crammed into completion in barely six months considering the onset of the 2022 elections.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN

On motion of Rep. Gil “Kabarangay Jr” A. Acosta, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Lagman's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

On further motion of Representative Acosta, the Chair recognized in the Zoom videoconference Rep. Gabriel H. Bordado Jr. for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BORDADO

Representative Bordado stated that even before the COVID-19 pandemic, the country's education system was already in dire need of support and strengthening, with issues such as lack of proper classrooms, inadequate learning materials, and disproportionate teacher-student ratio; and surmised that said problems have risen to alarming heights after more than a year into the pandemic.

After citing local and international pre-pandemic assessments on the state of the Philippine education system, he pointed out that the challenges brought by the current global health crisis, such as the shift to online learning education made more difficult by language barriers, has resulted in fewer enrollees and lower quality of education.

He hence emphasized, among others, strengthening the Mother Tongue-Based Multilingual Education program to address challenges in student learning and comprehension; and allocating more resources to train, educate, and produce competent teachers.

REFERRAL OF PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BORDADO

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Acosta, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Bordado's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

TERMINATION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On another motion of Representative Acosta, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

At 5:50 p.m., the session was suspended upon Representative Acosta's motion.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 6:01 p.m.

EXPLANATION OF VOTES

1. Rep. Ferdinand R. Gaite, in the Zoom videoconference, explained that while the Bill will respond to the need to modernize public health system for emergency preparedness, he however expressed worry that following the “scrap and build” policy in creating new agencies from reorganized ones, the frontline hero-employees of several Department of Health (DOH) offices might lose their jobs with the creation of the CDC. He pointed out that the Bill nor existing laws do not guarantee security of tenure as provided for in the Constitution. He therefore voted against the Bill.

2. In also voting “No,” Representative Zarate, through Zoom videoconferencing, asked

whether employees could lose their jobs if they fail to meet the qualifications of the CDC despite their long-term employment in the DOH agencies concerned. He also opined that the Bill should clearly state the parameters for performance-based incentives because private health facilities might just make profit out of public funds. He added that the House should harmonize the Bill with that creating the virology institute.

3. Representative Elago said she was concerned about the imminent loss of jobs due to the transfer of some DOH units and functions under the measure. She stressed that instead of creating a new agency such as CDC, the government should strengthen the public health care system; provide more funds and work opportunities as well as access to quality services up to the barangay level, in the health sector; and end the commercialization and privatization of health services. She likewise voted against the Bill.

With 192 affirmative votes, six negative votes, and zero abstentions, the Body approved on Third Reading House Bill No. 9171. (See also Appendix)

EXPLANATION OF VOTES

The following Members explained their votes:

1. Rep. Arlene D. Brosas opposed House Bill No. 9171 because she believed that a) the measure is anti-poor considering that the primary consumers of sando bags are indigents; b) it is unfair to tax small plastic sellers when the corporate income tax of large businesses were reduced due to the passage of the CREATE Law; and c) it is inhumane and unacceptable to use the measure's perceived benefits to the environment as an excuse vis-à-vis the accessibility and affordability of plastic bags to ordinary citizens.
2. In explaining her "No" vote, Representative Elago, through Zoom videoconferencing, stated that while the Bill intends to cause change in the manufacture and utilization of single-use plastics, the new excise tax means additional burden passed on to consumers and workers. Instead of additional taxes, she underscored that the Duterte administration must prioritize urgently needed *ayuda* by realigning billions of infrastructure, police, military and intelligence funds; improve tax collection and administration; fund

the health, education, national industry, and environmental sectors; and step up the implementation and funding of plastic recycling, upcycling, and downcycling efforts.

EXPLANATION OF VOTE OF REPRESENTATIVE GAITE

In explaining his “Yes” vote, Representative Gaité, via Zoom teleconferencing, recognized the need to strengthen and support physical therapists. However, he opined that the Bill lacks provisions with regard to the regularization, and prohibition on the contractualization of; minimum salary of; and free and continuing professional development for physical therapists.

INSERTION OF VOTES ON HOUSE BILL NO. 9216 INTO THE RECORDS OF THE HOUSE

At this point, due to power interruption, on motion of Representative Nieto, there being no objection, the Body approved to reflect the votes of other Members on House Bill No. 9216 in the records of the House.

TRANSMITTAL TO THE SENATE OF HOUSE BILLS

On another motion of Representative Nieto, there being no objection, the Body directed the Secretary

General to immediately transmit to the Senate copies of the House Bills that had just been approved on Third Reading.

ADOPTION OF SENATE BILL NO. 2232 AS AN AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL NO. 5777

With the concurrence of the Committee on Ways and Means and the authors of House Bill No. 5777, on motion of Representative Nieto, there being no objection, the Body adopted Senate Bill No. 2232, taxing persons engaged in the Philippine offshore gaming operations (POGO), as an amendment to House Bill No. 5777, through *viva voce* voting.
